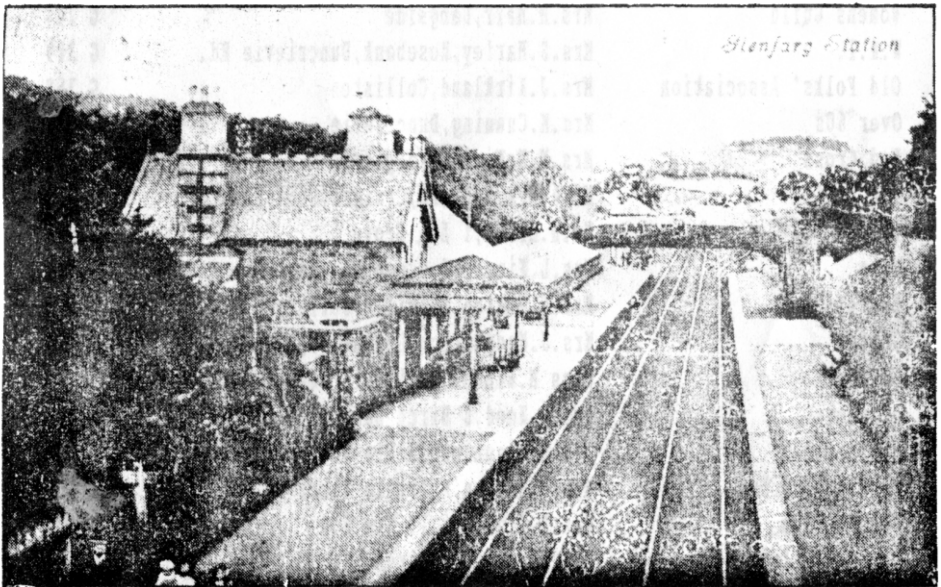

### COMMUNITY OOUNCIL

The following is an extract from the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on Monday 2 July 1990, the topics included being those considered to be of most interest to residents. Other topics were discussed, but there is insufficient space in the Newsletter for the minutes to be reproduced in their entirety. A copy of the minutes is available in the Post Office for anyone wishing to see it.

### CONTROL OF FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

Cllr. McFarlane .....considered that the future development of the village Should be re-examined, so that the views of residents could be taken into account. The Chairman asked Lady Maclean if she would be prepared to review the matter. In reply, Lady Maclean stated that, whilst she was not in favour of the formation of a sub-committee for the purpose, she would be prepared to take soundings of local opinion, and produce an outline document for consideration and discussion by the Council and the public.

### PURCHASE OF MARQUEE

Cllr. Brough reported that he had received a quotation of £3220 for a second-hand marquee of size 50'x 30', of the type which had been hired for the village fete..... the council re-affirmed its decision to make the purchase... Cllr. Brough was given authority to continue negotiations..

### GARDENS COMPETITION

Cllr. Mee reported that the six adult entries and the three junior entries to the competition were a rather disappointing response, but he felt that it would be worth repeating the competition next year. The Chairman said he would like to record the Council's appreciation of the donation of trophies by Cllr. Mee's company (Cosalt International Ltd.), and by Cllr. Mrs. Baird.

### STATIONERY - NOTELETS

The Secretary reported that he hoped that the notelets would be on sale by the end of the month. He expressed the Council's thanks and gratitude to Mr. James Douglas, who had prepared the sketches used in the notelets.

### RIGHTS OF WAY

Cllr. McFarlane reported that the Rights of Way maps were now available, and supplies would be placed in the Post Office and in the two hotels for the use of visitors and residents using the Rights of Way. The Chairman thanked Cllr. McFarlane and his sub-committee for their efforts.

The next meeting of the Community Council will take place on Monday 3 September in the Arngask Church Hall at 8 pm.

## PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Main Street At the request of the Chairman, Lady Maclean explained that she had visited the District Council offices to examine the application for planning approval, submitted by A.J.Stephen Ltd., to develop the land on the west side of Main Street, where it leads to the A 90 road, comprising 2.179 hectares. She stated that the outline plan consisted of two phases, phase 1 comprising 20 houses, and phase 2 comprising 25 houses. In reply to a question she further stated that it appeared that the development appeared to be subject to a negotiable contract for the sale of the land in question. The type and size of houses to be built was not stated in the planning application. In view of the concern created by the proposed plan, the Chairman invited questions and observations from members of the public present, most of whom were resident in the area likely to be affected by the proposed development.

The Chairman then summed up the feeling of the meeting, and the Secretary was requested to make an appropriate representation to the District Council, to point out that:

- a) a development of the magnitude of the one proposed by A.J.Stephen Ltd. would alter the character of Glenfarg village, and could not be viewed as an improvement;
- b) the sewerage and water facilities of the village are already operating at maximum capacity, and would not be able to cope with the additional demands created by the proposed development;
- c) the existing primary school is not large enough to be able to accept the additional intake of pupils likely to arise from the influx from the proposed housing estate;
- d) the development would have an adverse effect on the amenity of the existing houses bordering Main Street at the end of the village;
- e) Glenfarg has always been considered as an area of outstanding natural beauty. The proposed development would detract from the rural nature of the village, and thereby militate against the natural beauty of the area.

**GLENFARG WOODS** Since becoming elected in April 1989 I have been striving to have the Glen tidied up, by the removal of dead and broken trees. Gradually, with the help of Mr. John Freeman in our Planning Department, the landowners have been contacted, and they are co-operating in the clean up campaign. Dead elms are being cut down, and will gradually be taken away. I appreciate that it is a costly business, and thank the owners who have responded to date. Hopefully, in the long term, the tourist route through the glen will be beautiful again, and visitors and locals will be able to enjoy their drive.

**PLANNING** Planning applications from all over Kinross-shire and Glenfarg continue to flood the Planning Department. We are a very popular area for people wishing to make their homes. The future development and size of our small towns and villages gives rise to a good deal of controversy and strong feelings among residents. I am very aware of the issues, and shall continue to strive for a "happy medium", looking at each planning application on its own merits, but within the individual context of the community involved.

**PERTH IN BLOOM** Perth is taking part in the "Scotland in Bloom" competition this year, and again I would like to encourage our communities to enter into the spirit of this. What a pleasure it would be to see our streets with colourful window boxes, hanging baskets and planters displaying bright summer flowers. Perhaps our youngsters could be persuaded to get involved by parents, schools, youth organisations etc. - a concerted effort to make our towns and villages bright and beautiful in 1990.

**VANDALISM** Do you realise that last year vandalism in Perth and Kinross cost in excess of ONE MILLION POUNDS, money that could have been better spent on community projects. This problem affects us all. We must work together if we are to stamp out this serious problem in our community. We all live in the community - help make our community a better place in which to live.

**THE SOLUTION** Report it to the police immediately - telephone Kinross 63571 or Perth 21141 - so that action can be taken to stop VANDALISM.

**SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL CRIME PREVENTION PANEL**  
The Kinross-shire Crime Prevention Panel met on Thursday 5 July 1990.

**LITTER** The Crime Prevention Panel appeals to all shopkeepers and occupiers of commercial premises to play an active part in the elimination of rubbish. When litter accumulates outside their premises we would ask that they acquire a substantial litter bin. This need not be unattractive, and can also carry a name or an advertising slogan for the trader concerned. Kinross-shire is a relatively clean and tidy county, but we do have our litter problems in certain areas. The new

Environmental Protection Bill clearly places the responsibility on the owners of businesses which generate litter. Let us anticipate the Bill by resolving the problem NOW. It is suggested that litter bins be purchased through Perth & Kinross District Council, Department of Environmental Health, Perth.

A competition will be introduced for children in both Secondary and Primary schools for the best suggestions on dealing with litter. The aim is to make and maintain Kinross - shire as THE TIDY COUNTY. It is hoped that Community Councils will assess the need for litter bins in their areas and discuss the matter with their District Councillor.

Dog fouling is an ever-increasing problem. There is an experimental dog exercise area at the Kirkgate. This will be evaluated after six months and, if successful, extended to other areas of the burgh. It seems that most people are unaware that "pooper scoops" can be obtained at the County Buildings FREE. Dogs form an important part of many people's lives, but with ownership also comes responsibility - please help us to resolve this problem.

Kinross-shire has its fair share of burglaries and break-ins, the majority of these can be avoided by various means - probably the most efficient and rewarding is "Neighbourhood Watch". One is already operating successfully in Kinross, and others are proposed at Powmill and Kinnesswood. The Committee strongly supports these, not only for the protection of people and property, but also for the opportunity of getting to know your neighbours. Those wishing further information have only to ask the Police or any member of the Crime Prevention Panel. Incidentally, many Insurance Companies will give you a discount on you premium if you are a member of the "Neighbourhood Watch".

Concern was expressed at the vandalism in Davies Park. The new skate board was badly damaged before it was even completed. Its repair cost money which could have been spent elsewhere for the Community's benefit. The Police have been asked to keep this matter under observation.

Recycling of various materials will play an important part in environmental improvement - bottle banks have been very successful. Perth & Kinross District Council are likely to extend their recycling operations, and it is hoped that Kinross will be designated a collecting centre in due course.

## CRIME PREVENTION

### Advice to householders on unoccupied houses

Before you leave the house ensure that:

Any valuables not required are deposited in the bank, or another secure place.

Your garden implements and ladders are locked away, and your garage, greenhouse and garden shed are secured.

All locks and fastenings are in good condition, and ensure all doors are locked, and windows closed securely.

DO NOT draw your blinds or curtains. This attracts attention to the fact that the house is empty.

DO NOT lock your desks and bureaux, for this often results in considerable damage to valuable furniture if your home should be broken into.

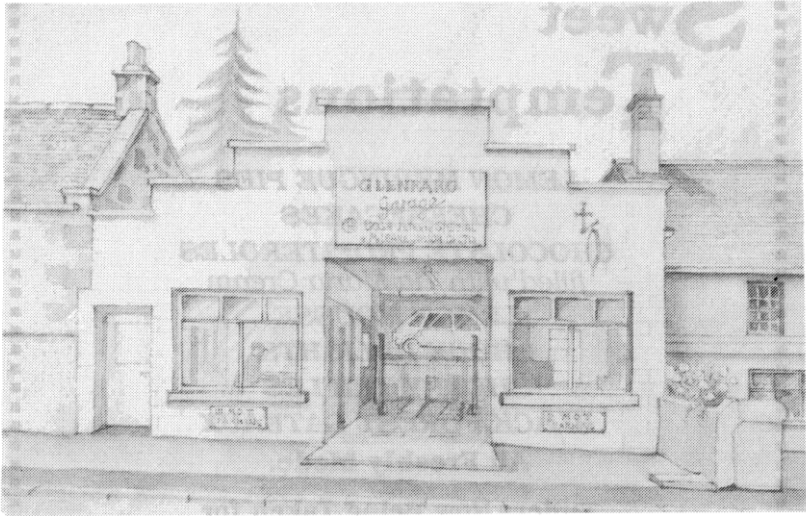

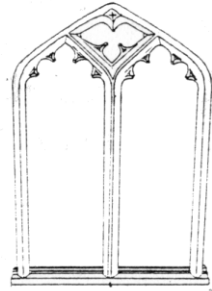

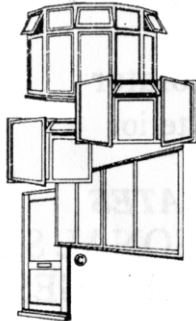
