ARNGASK CHURCH

Arngask Church is the old parish one and was built in 1806. The foundations of the older structure, which dated from before the reformation, are still to be seen in the adjoining church yard. The church indeed was originally a chapel built for the accommodation of the family of Balvaird and their dependants. The day school and indeed part of the village was up beside Arngask Church in the olden times. The church is now in disrepair.

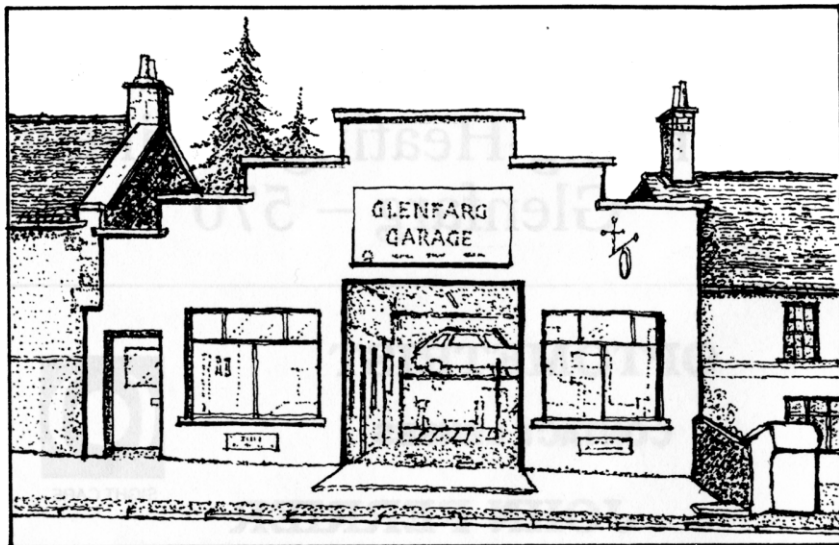

EDITORIAL

Well, I did warn you that there would be another little poetic gem in the Autumn, so here goes - Autumn's come, the grass has sunk, have the birdies done a bunk? Most of them should have by now, although the painting at our house was somewhat delayed by a family of swallows who, in the middle of September hadn't even left the nest, let alone the country. They have now packed their bags, however, and hopefully will make it to sunnier climes. As far as the grass, at the time of writing ours is showing no signs whatsoever of sinking!

If you read, as I hope you will, the Community Council's report, you will see that at the last meeting the subject of golf practice in the park was discussed, and, it was requested that attention should be drawn to this matter. Obviously the playing of golf in the park is a potentially dangerous habit, but the Council recognises that the park is really the only suitable place for it, and has no wish to forbid it.

The Council asks instead that common sense be exercised, that practice balls are used, and that players keep a look-out for people, particularly young children, who are in the area and may be unaware at the possible hazard.

Mr. Lindsay has tendered his resignation as the organiser of advertisements for the newsletter. Anyone who feels that they would like to take over this job should contact any member at the Community Council, or myself. Mr. Lindsay will be happy to assist his successor, if required, in the early stages.

COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The following is an extract from the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on 3 September, at which 15 members at the public were present. As always, a copy of the minutes is available in the Post Office, for anyone wishing to see it.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS ... there was nothing to report on the proposed development of Main Street. As far as the Arngask Farm development was concerned the present developer has proposed to sell the area in three parcels, but it was not known how far this proposal had progressed. Lady Maclean is organising a public meeting to ascertain the general feeling of the community as to the future development of the village in broad terms. The chairman.... pointed out that although the meeting is not a Community Council meeting, the Community Council would have regard to views expressed at Lady Maclean's meeting.

ROADS

1. Church Brae - the problem disappears if the hake in the roadside ditch is kept clear Tayside Regional Council are pursuing the matter with the Riding School-
2. Duncrievie Road - TRC state that the broken gully frame has to be specially cast. Negotiations are in progress
3. Unmade road leading off Greenbank Crescent -PKDC have indicated that the earliest date by which any work could be undertaken on this road would be in their budget year 1994/5. Cllr. Mrs. Graham undertook to make enquiries to see whether this matter can be expedited.
4. Road verges - These have been cut twice since the date of the last Community Council meeting.
5. Car parking area at Wallace Park - Following complaints about the loose chippings being thrown onto the grass by the action of turning vehicles, the Director of Leisure and Recreation is obtaining costs for the removal of some of this surface material and re-coating the area with "fines".
6. Main Street - PKDC advise that they are not the owners of the strip of land which separates Main Street from the M90 motorway. The Secretary is continuing enquiries to find out where the ownership of this piece of land does in fact lie.

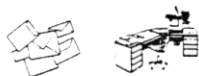

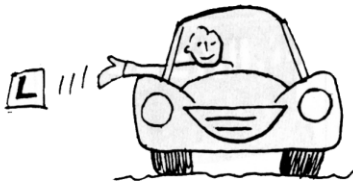

7. General - complaints were made about the deterioration of the road surface of Hayfield Road and Duncruevie Road, and about the state of the pavement on Main Street. Cllr. Mrs. Graham undertook to make enquiries of the Roads Department to see whether these matters could be attended to.

PROPOSED HEALTH CENTRE - KINROSS the public meeting in Kinross had supported the proposal to establish a Health Centre at the Lathro site at the northern end of Kinross, on the road to Milnathort.

CENSUS The Council has been notified that a Census of Population will be taken on 21 April 1991.

LOCAL BUS SERVICE It was noted with pleasure that Earnside Coaches (on contract to TRC) will be operating an off-peak minibus service between Glenfarg and Kinross. The service will begin on 1 October, initially on an experimental basis, and will operate in conjunction with the current Fife Scottish service. The Chairman, commending this service, stated that he hoped the new service would be well-supported by Glenfarg residents. He also urged the need to publicise the service.

PERTH VICTIM SUPPORT SCHEME Cllr. Mrs. Wood reported on the meeting she had attended in Perth on 22 August, at which it was agreed to proceed with the establishment of a Victim Support Scheme in Perth.

CHILDREN'S PANEL ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR TAYSIDE An appeal has been received from the CPAC, Tayside, which wishes to recruit new members. A notice has been displayed in the Post Office, and any persons interested in this work should apply direct to the CPAC as indicated in the notice.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH Residents in the Gallowhill estate have been receiving enquiries as to whether they would be interested in the formation of a neighbourhood watch scheme for the estate. It was suggested that, to avoid any possible duplication of effort and resources, the promoters of the scheme should liaise with Mr, J. Lindsay.

WALLACE PARK The Secretary reported having received a complaint from a resident about youths practising golf in the park. members expressed their concern at the potential danger, and risk at serious injury to children and grown-ups from being struck by a golf ball. At the same time the Council appreciates that there is no other convenient area where boys can practice. The Council saw little danger if plastic practice balls were used. The Chairmanasked for attention to be drawn to it (this matter) in the newsletter.

SUBMISSION TO SCOTTISH DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT The Chairman referred to a discussion paper he had received from the Scottish Development Department relating to a review at the Town and Country Planning (General Development) (Scotland) 1981. He suggested that the Community Council should make a submission prepared by Lady Maclean, the Secretary and himself.

PLANNING MEETING

On Wednesday 19 September, at the request of the Community Council, I held a meeting in the Village Hall to decide what line, if any, the people lo Glenfarg would like the C.C. to take when approached about planning applications.

Twenty two people attended, and I was very grateful to Elizabeth Carswell for writing the minutes for me. A full report will be given at the next C.C. meeting, on Monday 6 November at 8 pm in the Church Hall.

Briefly, there was unanimous agreement, both by those attending the meeting, and those who spoke to me beforehand, that no-one wanted Glenfarg to change in any way. It was decided, however, that as no village can remain frozen in time, a growth rate of nil to 1% would be tolerated to make sure the village did not die, and the density of any new buildings would be similar to the rest of the village, as it is at the moment.

BOOK PREMIERE FOR GLENFARG

Glenfarg Post Office claimed a first by having copies of "Taking the Land in Hand" on sale more than a full week before the book's official launch on 11 October. Mr. Reid was confident a good number of local people would wish to buy a copy of the book, especially if it carried the author's signature. Author John Sinclair was being more cautious. He warned..."Taking the Land in Hand" is not a novel or light bedtime reading. It is a serious attempt to address the subjects of Land Use and the Rural Economy, including the problems of rural housing."

Of the many original proposals in the book, that of taking a fifth of the land into Community Ownership is expected to arouse most national controversy, but there will be many political persuasions who will support the call for a doubling at the area under forestry over the next thirty years.

Although "Taking the Land in Hand" is written from a European perspective, it has a distinctly Scottish accent, as Scottish homes, Scottish enterprise and the Highlands and Islands Development Board are all seen as exemplars for similar agencies in EC Europe.

Co-author, David Sinclair, gave valuable assistance to his father in the preparation of statistics and graphics, while Charles Kennedy MP has contributed a generous foreword. The cover price of the book is £6.95, but Glenfarg Post Office has a "special offer" for October.

SOMETHING TO GET YOUR TEETH INTO

On 1 October 1990, a new dental contract comes into effect, the first change since 1948. One of the biggest changes is that anyone who wants NHS treatment will have to be on a particular dentist's list, as with doctors, otherwise they will not be entitled to treatment, except for certain circumstances, such as when away from home. The patient will be placed on a list for 2 years, but will have the right to go elsewhere during that time, without having to give a reason. If the dentist wishes to remove the patient from his list, he will have to do so through the local Family Health Service Authority. Although the NHS is OBLIGED to provide medical care for all, it is only PERMITTED to offer dental care, so patients cannot be assigned to a dentist's list.

FULL DENTURE patients will also have to go on a list, and be examined at 2 - yearly intervals, to be entitled to free repairs, free home visits and NHS treatment.

There will also be written treatment plans - itemised plans and estimates of the work to be carried out - designed so that the dentist can explain the various treatments possible, enabling the patient to seek a second opinion if wished. It is possible for the treatment to be part NHS and part private.

Better emergency treatment is also planned, so that patients on a dentist's list can expect emergency cover just as they would from their doctor. This is an area that dentists opposed to the new contracts are particularly concerned about, as it is sometimes difficult to identify a dental emergency, and 24 hour cover could be difficult, such as in the case of a single practice.

Basic fees remain the same, 75% of the cost being paid by the patient, the rest by the NHS. To encourage preventive dentistry, the dentist receives an annual fee for every patient on his list.

FREE TREATMENT is available for people under 18, or 19 in the case of students in full time education, pregnant women and those with babies up to 1 year old, and people on Family Credit or Income Support. Some people with low incomes may be able to obtain help towards costs.

90% of dental work is carried out on the NHS, but the other 10% includes a good deal of cosmetic dentistry. This can be done privately by a dentist who normally treats you on the NHS, or by a dentist not employed by the NHS. If a patient chooses this course, however, they must be sure they understand to what treatment they are agreeing once a patient has opted out of the NHS there will not be the same redress. Only NHS complaints are dealt with by the local Family Health Services Authority.

Little publicity has been given to the new dental contract - if in any doubt, consult your dentist.

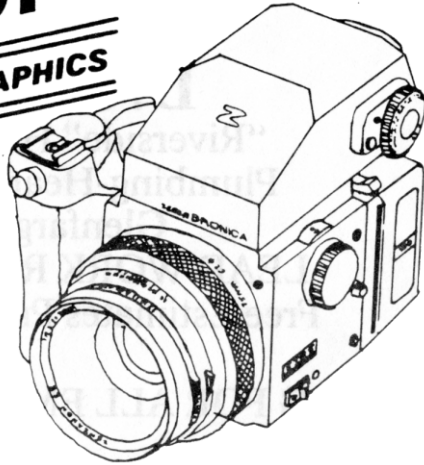
