COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The following is an extract from the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on Monday 5 November, at which 7 members of the public were present. A full copy of the minutes is available in the Post Office.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS Contrary to reports in the local press, planning permission for the Stephen proposal to build 25 houses at the site at the north end of Main Street had not been granted.

MARQUEE Cllr. Gent reported that a marquee had now been purchased.... Cllr. Gent was requested to obtain quotations to cover the insurance...

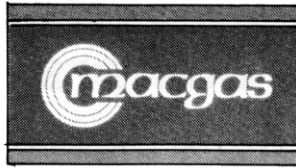
ROADS AND DRAINAGE Greenbank Crescent. Cllr. Mrs. Graham reported that she had pressed the matter with that department (TRC Roads), and she had been informed that basic repairs would be carried out within the next fortnight the area on which the lock-ups stand is not the responsibility of TRC's Roads Department, but appears to be the responsibility of Perth & Kinross District Council. She is continuing to make enquiries at the District Council offices.

Cllr. Gent referred to theflooding of the road at the north end of Main Street.....The Secretary undertook to write to the Divisional Engineer and the Environmental Health Department on the matter.

The Secretary pointed out that there remained only one street name sign at the junction at Birch Lane with Ashgrove, and that the absence of the corresponding sign at the other side of Ashgrove was causing confusion to delivery drivers seeking the lower numbers of Birch Lane. It was agreed that the Secretary should raise the matter with the appropriate department. It was also pointed out that confusion would be greatly reduced if residents would display their names and/or house numbers at the pavement end of their driveways.

J.A.C.K.E.T. AND SCOTTISH HOMES The Secretary explained that it had become necessary to deter these two items to a special meeting of the Community Council, which will be addressed by a member of these.....organisations..... This meeting will be open to the public

RIGHTS OF WAY Mr. McFarlane reported that he had been in touch with Mr. Murison over the matter, relating to the erroneous marking of a right of way across part of Mr. Murison's property, and the matter had been satisfactorily settled....

TAYSIDE REGIONAL COUNCIL - REVIEW OF ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS The Secretary referred to the public notice issued by TRC indicating a possible change in Ward boundaries which, if adopted, would result in Glenfarg being transferred to a Ward with Forgandenny and Dunning.....Although the Council appreciated that adjustments....may be necessary from time to time it viewed with

dismay and concern the proposed transfer of Glenfarg, believing that such a transfer would be to the disadvantage of the community. The Secretary was requested to lodge a strong protest with TRC.

HAND RAIL - CHURCH BRAE The Secretary reported having received a copy of a letter from TRC to Mr. H.B. Marland, indicating that the hand rail would be installed 'as soon as possible'.

THE QUALITY OF LIFE The Council noted with gratification the receipt of a letter from Provost Alex Murray, thanking Community Councils for their efforts which had resulted in Perth and Kinross being placed first in a poll on the Quality of Life, in a survey which covered the whole of Britain.

GLENFARG NEWSLETTER The Secretary reported that he had received a letter from Mr. J.M. Lindsay indicating his wish to retire from the task of co-ordinating the advertising material for Glenfarg Newsletter at the end of this year. The editor stated that she had approached Mrs. Margaret Ponton, who had expressed her willingness to take over from Mr. Lindsay. The Secretary expressed the Council's thanks to Mr. Lindsay, and its appreciation of his valued work in organising the advertising, which was the Newsletter's main source of revenue. Some discussion followed on the independence of the Newsletter, and it was agreed that the Newsletter should not simply reflect the views of the Community Council. The Council agreed that the expression of independent views is to be encouraged.

GALLOWHILL NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME It was noted that a scheme is in the process of being formed by the residents of Gallowhill estate. The Council hoped that the organisers would keep in close touch with Glenfarg's Crime Prevention Officer, Mr. J.M. Lindsay, to avoid any duplication of effort.

EDUCATION Cllr. Mrs. Wood said she believed that the Primary School was encountering some difficulty in obtaining sufficient funds from the Education Department for field work and she wondered whether the Community Council could help. There was some discussion on this matter and the Council, guided by Cllr. Mr. Ross, a former headmaster of the Primary School, felt that this was a matter for the School Board rather than the Community Council.

SUNDRY CORRESPONDENCE Mr. McFarlane asked that, as Mrs. Janet Thompson, a former Community Councillor, would shortly be leaving the area, the Secretary write a letter to her expressing the Council's thanks for her services to the community, and its good wishes for her future.

The next meeting of the Community Council will be held on Monday January 1991, at 8 pm in Arngask Church Hall.

ARNGASK WOMAN'S GUILD

Mrs. Rutherford, President, conducted the opening meeting of the Guild on Tuesday 2 October, at 7.30 in the evening. After the devotions, Mrs. Margaret Anderson, the Manse, Abernethy, showed an interesting and beautifully presented video of the Guild meetings in Edinburgh, and was warmly thanked by Mrs. Rutherford. The evening closed with the Doxology and the Benediction.

The Guild meeting on Tuesday 16 October was held in the Church Hall at 2.30 in the afternoon, and was presided over by Mrs. Rutherford. A report by Mrs. Anderson, President of the Perth Presbyterial Council of the Woman's Guild, was read by Mrs. Mair. The meeting then consisted of reports from the various branches of the Guild, and were read by the delegates. The World Mission and Unity report, by Miss Inglis, was followed by Hymn 259 from the "Junior Praise" book. The National Mission report was read by Mrs. Cunningham, and was

SCOUTS
