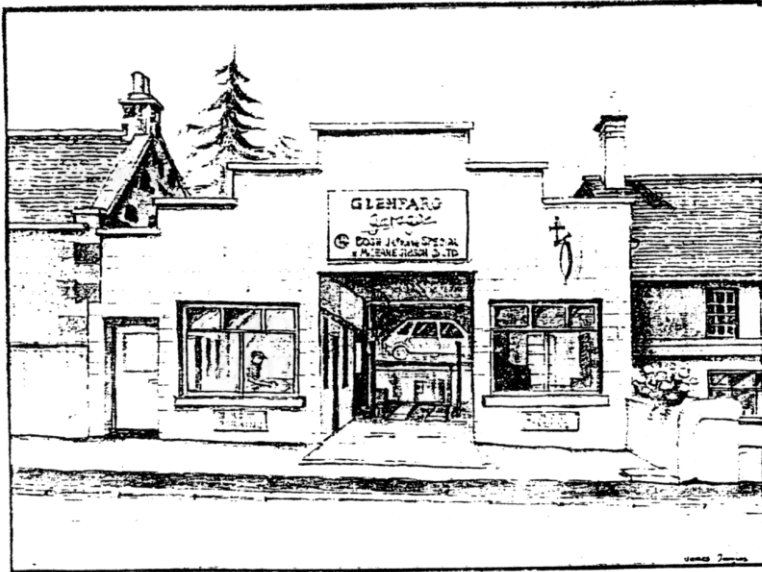

EDITORIAL

I hope everyone had a very happy Christmas and New Year. Although no worse than some previous winters, this recent cold spell certainly came as a shock after the mild winters we have had in the last few years. I have been asked to give a special mention to the Meals on Wheels (or should I say Meals on Feet) ladies, who struggled through the deep snow during the second week of January to ensure that the meals were still delivered. One recipient said that she didn't expect meals at all that week, and everyone is very grateful for the work that these ladies do.

COMMUNITY COUNCIL

There follows an extract from the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on Monday 14 January (postponed from 7 January on account of the inclement weather). A full copy of the minutes is available in the Post Office.

In addition to the councillors, three members of the public were present.

MARQUEE The Treasurer reported that he had obtained several quotations for the insurance of the marquee against all risks and that the most acceptable was from Lloyds it was agreed to accept the Lloyds quotation.

ROADS AND DRAINAGE The Secretary informed the meeting of the correspondence with the Divisional Engineer, whose letter indicated that there was no quick and easy solution to the problem of flooding at the north end of Main Street his department was trying to locate the source of the infiltration of groundwater into the sewage system, but it would take time Cllr. Gent asked if the Divisional Engineer could be invited to a meeting on site The Secretary agreed to advise the Divisional Engineer of this request.

DUNCRIEVIE - UNAUTHORISED TIP The Chairman reported on the unauthorised use of a plot of land in Duncrervie as a tip It was agreed that the Secretary should report the matter to the Department of Environmental Health for appropriate action to be taken.

CONSTITUTION The Chairman referred to the fact that whereas the present constitution provided for a total of twelve councillors, it had been the practice of the Council to elect only ten councillors, and this practice had become open to criticism by some residents. He continued that the constitution contained anomalies, and could with advantage be revised. The Secretary, agreeing that there are some anomalies in the present constitution, pointed out that this is not one of them: the constitution is quite clear that there should be twelve community councillors After some discussion it was resolved that the number of elected councillors be brought up to the permitted maximum of twelve The Chairman suggested that the Secretary be requested to draft a revised constitution and to eliminate any other anomalies, and arrange for the revised constitution to be approved by Perth and Kinross District Council, if possible by the date of the next Community Council meeting

PROPOSED ALTERATION TO ELECTORAL BOUNDARIES The Secretary reported that he had referred the matter to Sir Nicholas Fairbairn, QC, MP, who had replied that he was taking the matter up with the Regional Council.

GLENFARG AND KINROSS CIVIC TRUST An interim committee has been formed to pilot the scheme through, and is operating under the name of The Glenfarg and Kinross-shire Civic Trust a similar local civic trust had been formed in Dollar over 20 years ago , and had had considerable success in monitoring local building development. The founders believe that there is a need for a similar local civic trust to look after the areas of Kinross-shire and Glenfarg. Cllr. McFarlane suggested that a member of the interim committee be invited to attend the Council's next meeting to bring the Council up to date on progress

GLENFARG CRICKET CLUB the club would assess its first season, and the anticipated requirements of the forthcoming season. The Council were sympathetic towards the Cricket Club

Cllr. Ross, on behalf of the members of the Community Council, expressed his, and the Council's, regret that Cllr. Sinclair had felt compelled to give up his Community Council activities. He thanked Cllr. Sinclair for his work on the Council, and Cllr. Ross's words of appreciation were endorsed by the other members of the Council.

CHAIRMAN'S RESIGNATION

At the end of Monday's meeting of Council, Mr. John Sinclair announced his resignation as Chairman with immediate effect. Mr. Sinclair explained that in fifty years since leaving school to volunteer for the Services, he had maintained an arduous schedule in commercial, political and public affairs.

Pressures and excesses may have caught up, but of late he had felt less able to cope with demands on his time, and for that and personal reasons, he was announcing his resignation from all his remaining activities during January.

Mr. Sinclair said it had not been his intention to allow his name to go forward for re-election in the Spring. In the coming months and years the Community Council would be involved in taking vital decisions on a number of important issues to the village, not least future housing developments.

By announcing his resignation at this time Mr. Sinclair felt his colleagues would have more time to consider those best able to represent the wider and best interests of the neighbourhood in future.

In thanking Council for their support, particularly during the periods when he had been acting secretary and chairman, Mr. Sinclair expressed the appreciation of Mrs. Sinclair and himself for the many courtesies and kindnesses extended to them since they had come to live in Glenfarg.

Statement by John Sinclair 4 January 1991

GARDEN - LADESIDE

Over the past year we have been working to make the piece of land opposite this house, that formerly belonged to the Glenfarg Hotel, into an attractive garden. Passers by will have seen the changes gradually taking place, and when the big round central bed is planted up in the Spring, it should start to become the place of beauty that we intend. We would like it to be enjoyed by all who live in the village, so please know that all are welcome to come and walk, or sit, in it at any time. We would ask, however, that dogs are not brought in.

Readers may be interested to know something about the water cascade down the middle of the steps. These bowls, known as Flowforms, are so contoured that the water performs a rhythmic figure of eight in each bowl before passing on to the next. The design of them originates with John Wilkes, a sculptor/scientist in Sussex, who has always, apparently, been fascinated by water, and has spent years studying its nature and movement. He observed that, although subject to the straight pull of gravity, water nevertheless likes to meander in a circular and swirling fashion whenever it can, as can be seen in any burn or in a wave rippling and curling on the seashore. His aim in these Flowforms has been to mirror this habit in an aesthetically pleasing way.
