## EDITORIAL

My first reaction, when I heard of the Beacon Europe idea, was that no-one would want to go out to a "bonfire" at midnight on Hogmanay. If it was situated fairly centrally, however, it could be the source of an enjoyable social gathering for villagers, and might revive the pleasant practice of first-footing, which seems to have fallen into decline in recent years. Of course, as with all things, it would not just "happen", but if everyone did their bit it could prove to be good fun.

Also arising from the minutes of the Community Council meeting, I can sympathise with those who have other people's rubbish piled up in front of their houses awaiting collection. It has, however, long been the practice to take one's rubbish bags to the front of one's house in the morning, often quite early to be sure of not missing the "bin men". The main problem seems to lie with the mess caused by the wind and animals distributing the rubbish liberally about the village, and I wonder if, rather than asking the Council to change their policy, we should simply be asking villagers to make sure that their bags are securely tied.

I have been asked to bring to the attention of parents the fact that a number of young people are congregating around Arngask Farm, which is private property, although the new owner is seldom on the premises. The fact that the children are there is not a problem in itself, but following some damage and a small fire the neighbours are concerned that it is only a matter of time before there is a serious accident.

Many thanks to Mr. Deas and Mr. Wylie for supplying me with information concerning the names of our house. As well as Tennessee and Lyndhurst, it has apparently also been called Fidra, after the island off the coast of North Berwick.

In the name of progress we have had to give up our three figure Glenfarg telephone numbers, and learn to cope with the more cumbersome six digit ones.

Just a reminder that all Glenfarg numbers are now preceded by 830, Fossoway numbers by 840, Cleish Hills numbers by 850, and Kinross numbers by 8. For any of these places we now dial the number only, without a code, and we have lost the local code for Perth, now having to use the national code 0738. Got that?! Still, if we get it wrong a friendly recorded message will be quick to point out the error of our ways!

The foregoing, somewhat longer than usual, is just to prove that I can write an editorial without mentioning the weather! I hope you are all enjoying your holidays!

### COMMUNITY COUNCIL

There follows an extract from the minute of the Community Council meeting held on Monday 6 July, at which one member of the public was present.

TREASURER'S REPORT Cllr. Gent...drew the attention of Councillors to the amounts outstanding....from advertisers in the Glenfarg Newsletter.

PLANNING - NORTH END OF MAIN STREET The Secretary gave a summary of correspondence on this matter with the Planning Dept. of PKDC. .... the Council's objections to the fourth application ....had been supported by Kinross Civic Trust, and by the Convention of Community Councils. .... it was agreed that the Secretary write to the Chief Reporter of the Inquiry Reporters at the Scottish Office regarding a right of appeal against planning decisions.

DRAFT PERTH AREA LOCAL PLAN PKDC... agree to the deletion of "land adjoining Wallace Park" and "land adjoining the Coal Yard" from the finalised version of the PALP. It was noted that PKDC intend to include land at the North end of Main Street in the final version of the Plan.

REFUSE COLLECTION Complaints have been received ..... about the current practice of...removing the garbage sacks from the houses an hour or so before collection....and assembling these...in front of other people's frontages..... this leads to rubbish being strewn throughout gardens ..... An enquiry to a member of the crew produced the answer .... that the new practice enabled them to

complete their round more quickly. The Secretary was asked to bring the matter to the notice of the Department of Environmental Health .....

EUROPE DAY 1992 The Chairman reported that the Council had been approached by an organisation called "Beacon Europe", requesting the erection of a beacon in Glenfarg to be lit at midnight on 31 December 1992 (along with other beacons throughout Britain) to mark the advent of a single market. The Chairman stated that he was discussing the proposal with the Leader of the local Scout Troop to see whether the Scouts would be prepared to undertake this work.

FACILITIES FOR TEENAGERS The Chairman ..... had received a petition from a number of teenagers requesting the provision of a meeting place to be provided for their exclusive use. He ..... had asked them to be a little more specific in what they had in mind, and a reply is awaited.

ENVIRONMENT ....a young person had complained about the practice of farmers shooting foxes and hanging the carcasses on fences ..... the complaint should be directed to the Dept. of Environmental Health.

LAND FOR SALE Cllr. Lady Maclean, referring to the "For Sale" notice Posted by the Scottish Office on the land bordering the A90 by Paris Bridge, stated that her information was to the effect that no building would be permitted on this piece of land, which was considered only suitable for pony grazing or tree planting.

#### GLENFARG COMMUNITY COUNCIL

At the mid point of the year, most of us are looking forward to some kind of holiday or rest. Fortunately the weather, so far, has been reasonably kind, and we can only hope for more of the same for the rest of the summer.

The local council too, takes a holiday, with a cessation of meetings until the autumn. As a lot of our work is essentially liaison and correspondence with the council and its executive processes, a short period of rest is forced upon us. As can be seen from the minutes reported in this newsletter, we are still doing everything possible to discourage the proposed housing development at the north end of the village. The council have decided that the other two proposed

sites for housing development are unsuitable, but at present they are as keen as ever about the site under dispute.

The newsletter appears to be under the shadow of possible closure. Our main problem is cash flow, or lack of it. Increased printing costs, coupled with a dramatic fall in advertising revenue (due to advertisers delaying payment of invoices) have left the Community Council footing the not inconsiderable bill. A working party has been set up to address this problem, and hopefully the decisions reached will bear fruit by the time it meets again this autumn. If not, serious consideration to the cessation of the newsletter in its present format becomes inevitable.

It may be, of course, that the current format of the newsletter is not as popular as the editor and the Community Council believe. Only you, the villagers can tell us. Regrettably previous requests for comments on such things as developments within the village, the proposed new Forth Road Bridge etc., have produced little response. Sadly, I do not expect any more from this request; but please, if you like the newsletter the way it is, then tell us; if you don't, then tell us what you would like to see.

Most organisations are very good at giving the editor copy, whereas others contribute only rarely. Every organisation, of which there are many, within the village is entitled to submit copy, as is each and every villager.

The bottom line is simply this:

- 1) Please give the editor copy.
- 2) Please tell us what you want in the way of a newsletter.
- 3) Please ADVERTISERS - pay up!

If any of the above three requests is in the negative, I can only foresee the closure of our newsletter, by 1993.

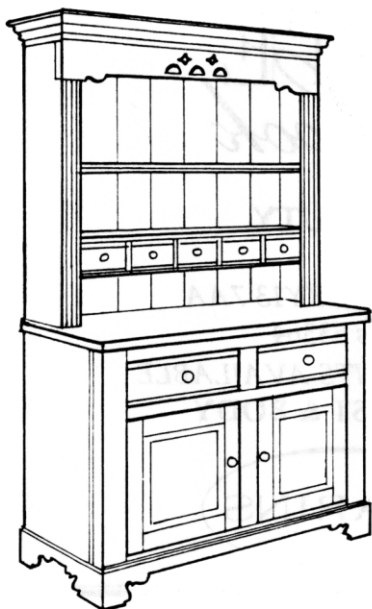
#### WANTED - SOMEONE TO HELP WITH GUIDES

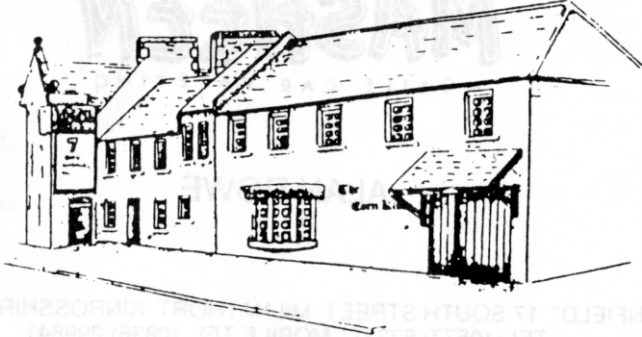

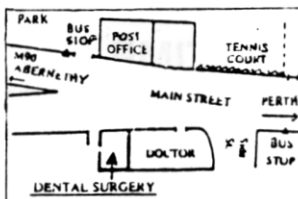
