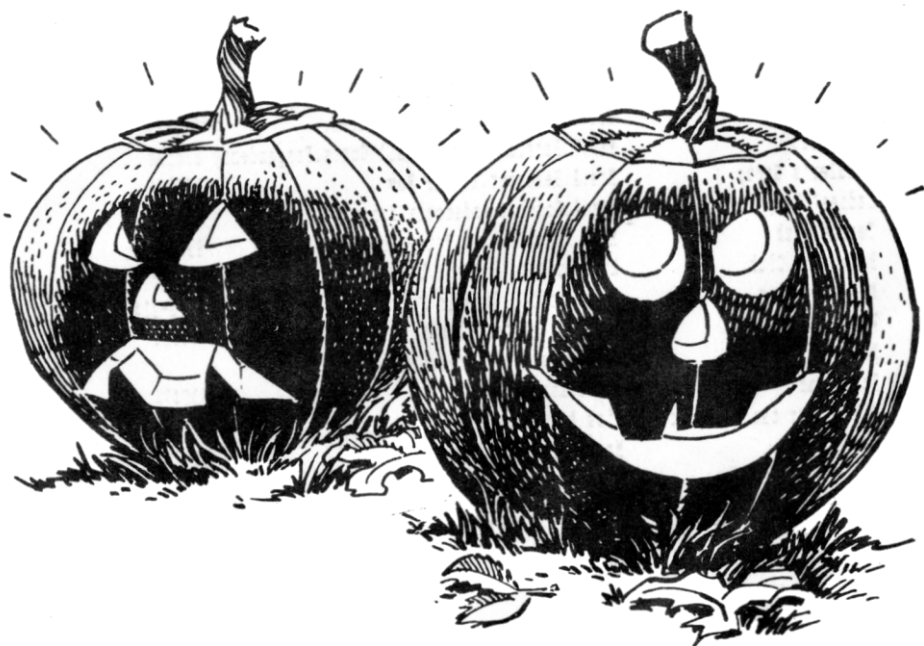

EDITORIAL

Many thanks to those people who responded to the enquiry about the newsletter in the last issue. I did have one request to publish mobile Library and Bank times, and these will now appear somewhere towards the end of the newsletter. One correspondent felt that a charge would be acceptable - I wonder how the majority of readers feel about that?

My apologies to Mr. Hume for omitting to mention a contribution from him. Following my enquiries about the changing of the name of our house from Tennessee to Lyndhurst, Mr. Hume showed me a card commemorating the Golden Wedding, the celebration of which was attended by his grandparents, of Mr. & Mrs. McKarsie, who were married in 1870. Mrs. McKarsie (I think) was American, hence the house name, and the card shows the Union Flag and the flag of the United States, together with a photograph of the couple. Mr. Wylie thinks that they lived in this house from the turn of the century until the beginning of the Second World War.

I am fascinated by the history of the village, and am always delighted to receive this kind of information.

PRESS RELEASE BY COUNCILLOR MRS. LAVA GRAHAM

GLENFARG/ORWELL LAND BOUNDARY CHANGES

Regional/District Councillor Lena Graham has written to the Boundary Commission of Scotland, and to the Scottish Office, protesting at the proposed changes for Glenfarg and Orwell Land. Councillor Graham said, "I think this is an absolute nonsense at a time when the whole concept of local government is under review, and the possible formation of single tier authorities will no doubt necessitate further changes and adjustments to electoral boundaries."

She is totally supportive of Glenfarg Community Council in its protestations to the Scottish Secretary regarding these boundary Changes, as there is absolutely no doubt that the natural links are with Kinross and Milnathort. The people of Glenfarg feel that they have nothing in common with the people of Dunning and Methven. There is not even a bus service from Glenfarg to Dunning, and all their social and cultural links are with Kinross and Milnathort. The area between Glenfarg and Dunning can be extremely hazardous over the winter months, and would make travelling difficult.

Councillor Graham is furious at what she sees as a numbers game which would be administratively convenient to the powers-that-be, with no thought given to the views of the local people who, in her eyes, are extremely important.

"It is simply bureaucracy gone mad. It is another blow to the freedom of choice for our rural communities. Surely even at this late stage these ridiculous proposals could be abandoned until a clearer picture emerges of the long term future of local government."

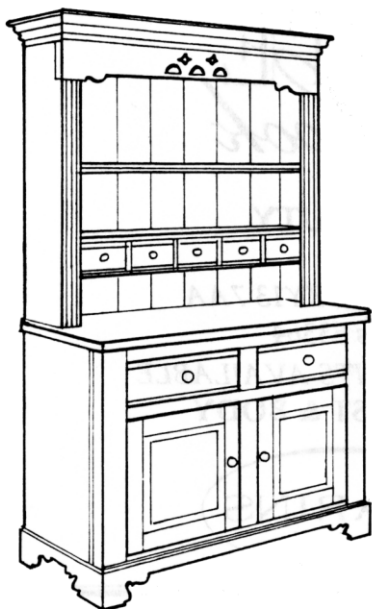

The following article was sent in by Janet Little, who thought that it might be of interest. She has drawings and plans of the castle, which I am sure that she would be willing to show to anyone who is interested.

BALVAIRD CASTLE

Balvaird Castle commands attention when one is walking around Arngask. When we first moved to Glenfarg in 1980 it was swathed in scaffolding, and remained like that for several years. Once the renovated building emerged I made enquiries about the possibility of a visit to the castle. Unfortunately this is not possible, either in the evenings or at weekends, and there are no funds available to enable the castle to be opened to the public in the near future. I did, however, discover something about the Castle, which may be of interest to readers of the Glenfarg Newsletter.

Balvaird Castle was taken into the guardianship of the Secretary of State for Scotland in 1975, and it is maintained by Historic Scotland. It is a fifteenth century keep, and is a fine specimen with regard to its planning, due to the special turret inserted inside the L-shape to accommodate the entrance and staircase. This enabled a wider, better staircase than would have been possible if it had been built up within the thickness of the wall as used to be the practice, to be built.

The ground floor is vaulted, and contains the usual stores, sleeping loft, a pit for prisoners, and the kitchen. The joists of the sleeping loft and the wall supporting them are still preserved. Looking in through the windows, it is possible to imagine which room, was which.

The first floor contains the hall and adjoining private room, complete with two garde-robes. The soil from the latter was removed by pulling out a movable stone from the wall at ground floor level between the kitchen and the storeroom. There is an unusual arrangement of stone spouts from the roof, whereby these garde-robes could be washed out by rain water! This certainly points to a degree of hygiene. Other interesting features of this castle are the watch tower over the staircase, and the good condition of the parapets. There were later additions to the castle, which effectively created a castle surrounding a courtyard, but most of these are now largely ruined. An enclosure to the south was once a pleasure garden, and to the east there is a large walled garden or orchard.

Over the arch of the entrance doorway are the remains of several armorial bearings. These are thought to be of Margaret Barclay and her husband Sir Andrew Murray, who lived in the reign of James IV. She was the surviving child of James Barclay of Kippo, and brought the baronies of Balvaird and Arngask with her in marriage. He was the youngest son of Sir William Murray of Tulliebardine. The title of Lord Balvaird is now merged with the title of Viscount Stormont, since the second Lord Balvaird succeeded to that title in the second half of the seventeenth century.

Many of the features described here may be observed from the outside, and should make a visit to the building more interesting.

GLENFARG GREEN

The old coalyard is an unattractive place at present, and definitely not a part of the village of which any of us can be proud. We don't want it to be thought that, because we haven't done anything to it so far, it is going to remain as it is. So, for everyone's general information, here is what we intend, and when.

The coalyard terraces will be bulldozed, shaped and contoured in with the existing field, covered with topsoil, and sown with grass and wild flower seeds. Ornamental trees and shrubs will be planted, as in the rest of the field, and there will be mown paths amongst them. We will plant a hedge along the tumbledown wall between the coalyard and that derelict strip of ground beyond - (which would make such an excellent car park for the village hall, if only its owners could be located and bought out).

Simultaneously a wildlife pond will be dug out and created in the flat bit of the field by the bowling green, fed by the burn. Because of the gravelly nature of the soil the pond will be lined with black polythene, but this will be covered with earth and won't be seen. We want to encourage schoolchildren to make use of it, so we will incorporate a hard edge at one point where they can dip jam jars and learn about pondlife.

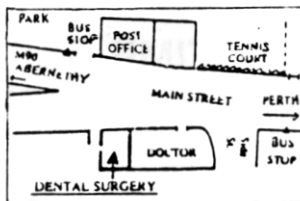

DOCTORS' SURGERY BRIDGE OF EARN

Mr. Donald Smith sent me the following letter regarding the withdrawal of the in-house dispensing facilities at the Bridge of Earn Doctors' surgery. He also enclosed a condensed copy of a report issued by the surgery, feeling that it may be of interest to the village.

Many residents who attend the surgery of Dr. David Kirkwood and Dr. Anne Urquhart at Bridge of Earn will have been concerned about the directive from the Health Board that the practice should cease to provide dispensing facilities. This results from notice of intention from another source to establish an independent Pharmacy in Bridge of Earn. Current regulations do not permit doctors to provide their own dispensing when there is a nearby Pharmacy. It is unfortunate that facilities which the practice was obliged to provide many years ago are now required to be closed, against the wishes of many patients. This is despite numerous letters of objection to the Health Board, Local Medical Committee and Members of Parliament.

It is a recent decision of the Health Board that the practice may continue dispensing until August 1994, but must then cease.

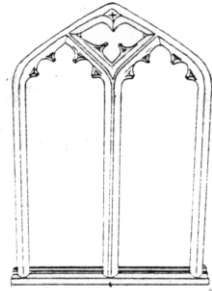

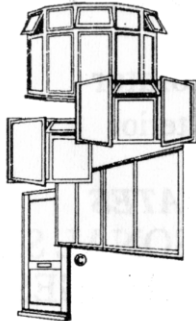

An appeal is to be made against this decision, and Drs. Kirkwood and Urquhart are hoping for continued support, as the closure of the dispensary will have an overall effect on the viability of the practice and the facilities which can be provided.

Report from Drs. Kirkwood and Urquhart

Dear Patient,

We thought it was time to officially update you on the situation regarding our dispensing facilities, and to dispel the rumours circulating in the village.

As you know from our previous newsletter and from the press, this Practice has been under threat due to the proposed opening of a chemist shop in the village. Many of you have been very supportive and helpful in writing to the Health Board, Local Medical Committee, and Members of Parliament to express your concern that this Practice may not be able to survive financially if we cease to dispense prescriptions. Thank you very much for all your support.

Unfortunately your views have not been taken into consideration at all, and our appeal to continue to dispense has been refused. We have been informed by the Health Board that we may continue our dispensing only until August 1994 and must then cease to dispense entirely for our patients.

Our service to you will continue for the next 2 years, during which time we will both be making every effort to expand the Practice sufficiently to enable us both to continue in practice after that date. We are also appealing further against this unfair decision, and will be striving to have the present inadequate regulations clarified legally. We look forward to your continuing support in our battle.

We look forward to your continuing support, and hope that we will be able to continue to expand sufficiently in the next 2 years.

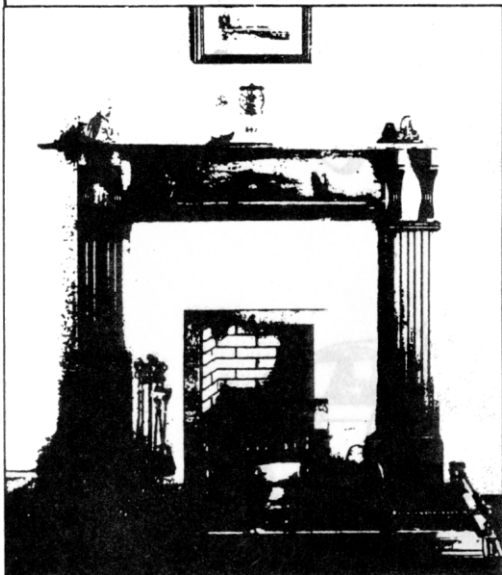

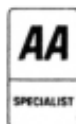

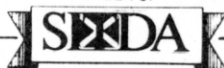
