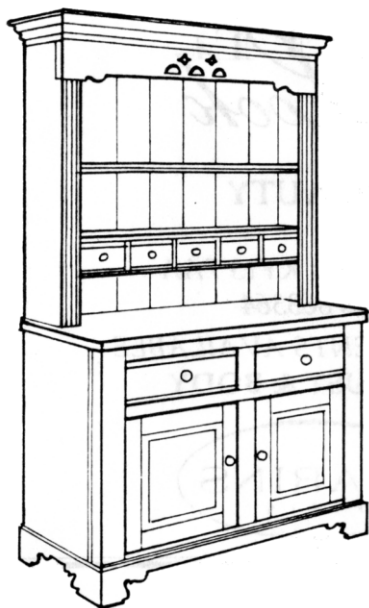

It makes it particularly sad to read of all the vandalism that is going on in the village, but hopefully this will lessen now that the lighter evenings are coming, and all the villagers will be able to enjoy the many amenities which we, in Glenfarg, are so fortunate to have.

## **Glenfarg Community Council**

The following is an extract from the minute of the meeting held on Monday 1 March., at which 6 members of the public were present.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOUNDARY COMMISSION** There was much discussion on this subject, a summary of which can be found in the Chairman's Annual Report, with more detail in the copy of the minutes in the Post Office.

**Boundary between Wards 13 & 14** An exact description of the boundary can be found in the Post Office, but it was agreed that this proposed boundary was not easily identifiable for practical purposes, and that a more practical solution would be to draw the boundary ..... along the line of the A9 road. The Secretary was requested to notify the Boundary Commission and PKDC accordingly.

**SPORTS FACILITIES - WALLACE PARK** Cllr. Murison reported on the meeting he had had with representatives of the Tennis, Football and Cricket Clubs, the Scouts and Venture Scouts, and a representative of PKDC's Leisure and Recreation Department. It was apparent that only the Tennis Club had the necessary financial strength to make a long-term financial commitment towards

the provision of a pavilion with changing facilities etc. .... Mr. Norris, Chairman of the Tennis Club, stated that his Club's proposal is to progress the matter in two stages. Initially the Club proposes to utilise the existing storage hut (other arrangements having been made for the removal and storage elsewhere of the marquee, chairs etc.) and, subject to the agreement of PKDC being obtained, develop the hut as temporary changing rooms for a trial period of perhaps two years. If this were successful the Club would be in a better position to formulate its plans for further development ..... After a brief discussion the Council agreed to support the Tennis Club in its proposal, for which Mr. Norris thanked them. In reply to a question ..... the Chairman stated that the hut could be made available to other clubs.

VANDALISM Three more instances of vandalism have been reported to the Council ..... The Chairman stated that he had been in touch with the local police who told him that they are aware of the identities of the culprits. Meanwhile, any further acts of vandalism or anti-social behaviour should continue to be reported to the Police.

LOMOND BANK .... the residents of Lomond Bank had requested that TRC should adopt a few metres of Lomond Bank, at its junction with Church Brae. This junction is used as a turning area by traffic using Church Brae, and as a result the road surface of the unadopted Lomond Bank has seriously deteriorated. The Council agreed to support this request, and the Secretary was asked to write to TRC accordingly.

HOUSING ....the Director of Housing's letter stated that once the Department's exercise in prioritisation had been completed he would be in a better position to indicate the houses in Glenfarg which would be provided with central heating.

DOGS Complaints were again being received of instances of dogs fouling the pavements in the village. The Chairman asked the Secretary to seek the assistance of PKDC to deal with this problem.

GLEN FARG Concern at the present state of the Glen, following the heavy snowfalls...and subsequent flooding, was expressed by several Councillors. The road A90 (B996) - A912 is signposted as a scenic tourist route, yet the entire Glen presents a sorry state of devastation and neglect. The Secretary suggested that appropriate remedial action required the attention of a number of bodies: TRC, PKDC, Tay River Purification Board and the Perthshire Tourist Board, as well as various land owners whose lands border the road .... The Chairman ..... asked the

Secretary to explore the possibilities of getting prompt and co-ordinated action from those whose responsibility it is to attend to these matters.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING will be held on Monday 29 March 1993, at 8.00pm in the Church Hall.

## **Chairmans Annual Report 1993**

This report covers the year from 1 March 1992 to 28 February 1993.

Much of the Council's time has been taken up on matters affecting the quality of life in Glenfarg. These matters are often the minutiae of life in a small community, but they are important, especially to those concerned. They are all detailed in the minutes of the Council's meetings, which are available for inspection by members of the public at Glenfarg Post Office, as well as being published, in edited form, in the village's bimonthly newsletter, copies of which are also available at the Post Office. The newsletter is not the organ of the Community Council; instead it enjoys the benefits of an independent editorship, which is to be valued and hopefully maintained. The Community Council does help finance the newsletter, which is supported by local advertising and some contribution by members of the public. Hopefully this report will be included in the next issue.

Our meetings are held bi-monthly, on the first Monday of each odd numbered month, at 8 pm in Arngask Church Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend the meetings but constitutionally have no right to address the meeting, unless they have written to the Secretary at least seven days prior to the meeting. In practice, the Chairman does allow members of the public to speak at his discretion, but this formal arrangement exists by decree from the Scottish Office, under the powers given to it under the Local Government Act of 1975, which also instituted the present arrangement of Regional and District Council. This two-tier system of local government is now felt to be less satisfactory than was once supposed, and we took part this year in the consultation process which will ultimately lead to a decision by the Secretary of State for Scotland regarding the introduction of a single tier of local government. Although I am not party to his decision, I predict that it is most likely that he will choose for us to reside in an area that was once known as Perthshire, concatenated with Kinross-shire, to

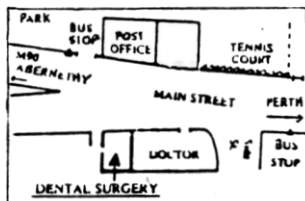

perhaps be labelled "Perth & Kinross" or just simply "Perthshire". We live in a time of change; perhaps just for the sake of change itself, since it will not escape the notice of the more longstanding residents that this "new" arrangement (give or take Clackmannanshire!) was exactly what was in force some 25 years ago!

The aforementioned Act of Parliament also empowered the present Local Boundary Commission for Scotland to review Regional and District boundaries at regular intervals. Last year such a review started and is still undergoing its lengthy "consultation" period. Regrettably the Boundary Commission's idea of consultation appears to differ significantly from a legal [apparently the Commission is headed by a High Court Judge] or dictionary definition since all representation to it from us was ignored. Instead it chose to recognise a request placed before it by this Community Council's predecessor some 17 years ago! No doubt our submissions will take effect next century! In short, we have been taken from our natural neighbours in Kinross and added to Methven and Dunning (Strathearn). I can only hope that we are able to elect a "Supercouncillor" who can actively represent these diverse areas equally at a Regional Council level. This ruling is currently under appeal by Tayside Regional Council and we are awaiting events. The consultation process is currently underway for setting the boundaries of District Wards, and we have put forward our views in the anticipation that they may be heard this time.

Planning, as always, took up the bulk of the Community Council's time this year. Regrettably, due to an administrative blunder by the Planning department of the District Council, costs were awarded to A. J. Stephen Ltd., in respect of their appeal to the Secretary of State. As such, the District Council felt they had no alternative but to allow a further planning application to proceed and a fifth planning proposal for a development by A. J. Stephen Ltd. to build up to 20 houses at the north end of the village was passed by the District Council on the nod. This is yet another fine example of democracy in action!

Since the last annual report the Old Coalyard site has begun to undergo a marvellous transformation at the hands and green fingers of a resident local couple who purchased the site last year. The owners asked for suggestions as to a name for it, and I am pleased to report that it is now known as Glenfarg Green. It is hoped in time that this will become a valued local horticultural amenity for both villager and visitor alike, but a recent setback, however, in the form of local vandals, may now put this in jeopardy. It goes without saying that the anti-social actions of the few will spoil the enjoyment and enrichment of many. We must all be on our guard, not only constantly to teach our young how to respect property,

but also to report such goings on, no matter how trivial, to the proper authority, in this case the police. These days it seems fashionable to transfer blame for these and other social ills from the actual perpetrators onto such abstract causes as the "recession" or "unemployment". In the same vein, it is also beholden to those in gainful employment to try and encourage the young to lend their activities to constructive rather than destructive pursuits.

1993 was welcomed to Glenfarg in a novel way this year. As part of a Europe-wide celebration of the European Community a number of beacons were lit across the length and breadth of the member states. The Scouts kindly built the beacon and asked the Chairman of the Community Council to light it and propose a toast for the New Year. This was duly performed, with the Community Council and a local hotel providing the toast! At the time, I noted that attenders seemed well behaved, and that all present were pleased with this form of celebration, but later on I learnt that the vandal was again present. I am unsure as to whether or not we should repeat this form of Hogmanay observance.

In January, an extraordinary snowfall, coupled with an even more rapid thaw, brought two types of disaster, one on another. The snow caused everything to grind to a halt, and prevented a number of villagers from reaching home or leaving, for days. Power cuts brought their own inconvenience, reminding us of our near total dependence on electricity; how quickly we forget that only a few generations ago electricity was a luxury few could hope to afford. I found it amusing that a concern was for food in freezers - when the biggest freezer of all was only outside the back door! The floods caused much more concern and worry. The water services and others tried tirelessly, sometimes in vain, to stem the inexorable flow of water towards and through some unfortunate villagers' homes. It is a pity that this sight will no doubt be repeated during similar weather in the future; a legacy of the myopic nature of planning decisions with which the home owners will have to learn to live. The weather touched everyone in the village, I don't think that any garden escaped damage of some sort. Life, however, has a way of healing the unfortunate episodes in the past and no doubt the passage of time will soon fill in the gaps caused by loss.

Looking back, I feel enriched by the way that everyone appeared to "pull together" to help friends and neighbours during this time of crisis. Perhaps new friendships and relationships may have been forged by this common experience, leaving us with a feeling that although a lot was lost at the time, more good came from it than was first thought. What is certainly encouraging was the willingness of the young and able to help the old and infirm without question; it seems a
