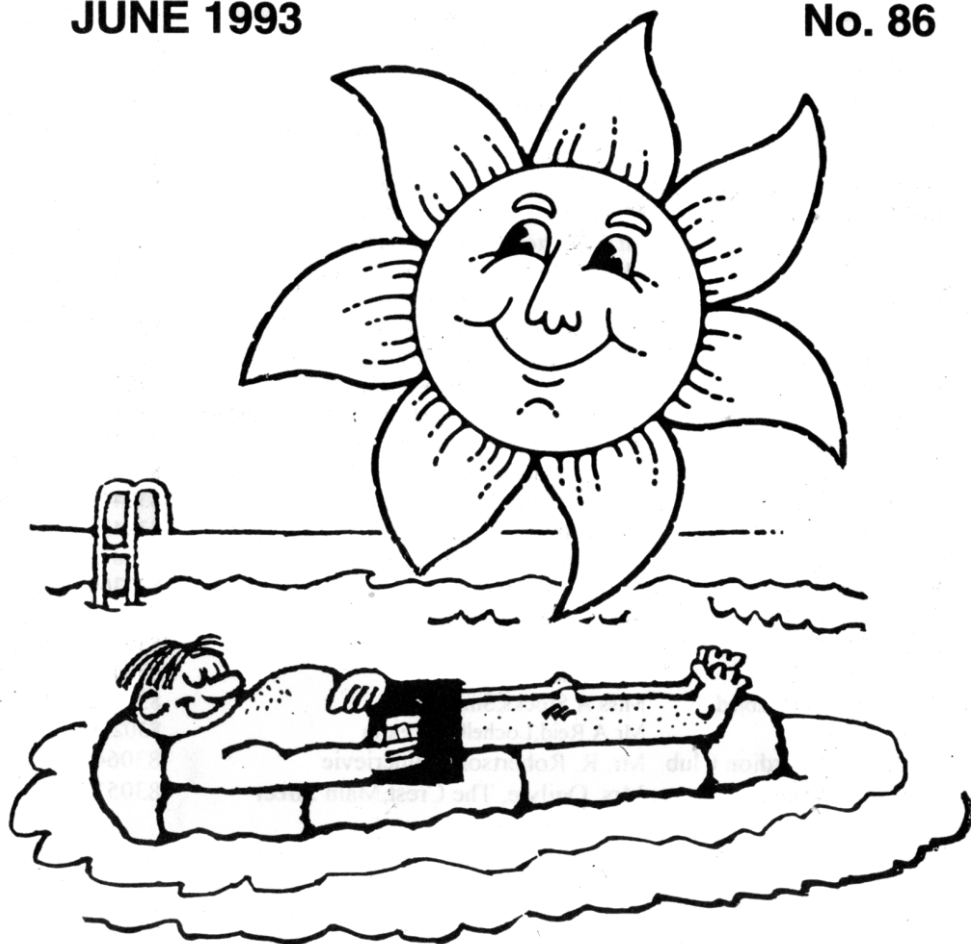

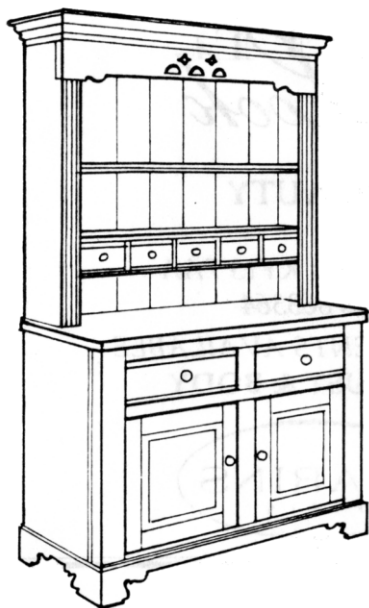

COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Extract from the minute of the meeting held on Monday 3 May, at which no members of the public were present.

TREASURER'S REPORT £1085 outstanding from advertisers who have taken space in the Newsletter. £236 had been received as a grant from PKDC.

SCHOOL PRIZE Interest from the Bond was only £53.81, as a result of the fall in interest rates. It was agreed that the Community Council would maintain its donation of £140 to the Prize Fund.

PUBLIC HALL ASSOCIATION It was agreed to donate £100 to the Village Hall extension fund.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOUNDARY COMMISSION The Secretary had reported the Council's view to LGBC, and PKDC had subsequently replied, saying that the Council's proposals would create an imbalance in the number of electors between Wards 13 and 14. It was decided not to pursue the matter.

CO-OPTION OF COMMUNITY COUNCILLOR There is a vacancy in the number of permitted Councillors this year, and it was agreed to invite Mr. John Learmonth to join the Community Council for the current year.

KINROSS-SHIRE CIVIC TRUST The Council agreed to renew its membership for this year.

RIGHTS OF WAY A new map/leaflet of Rights of Way is to be produced.

ROADS There has been no evidence of activity on the part of TRC in effecting the many repairs required. It was agreed to bring the matter to the attention of the Director of Roads and Transport.

the usual favourites. Just over £130 was raised for Scout Group funds. The next dance is on 26 June, and the profit from this dance will go to the Village Hall funds. Please be sure to book your tickets as we were very close to the maximum number that are allowed in the Hall. A phone call to Mr. Lambie (830295), or a word with any of the Scout Group committee, will ensure that you are not turned away. Tickets are £2.50 for adults, and £1.50 for children under 16.

The last Ceilidh is on 14 August, and tickets etc. are the same. It is you, our own Village folk, who we particularly want to be meeting at the Ceilidhs, but if foreigners from Kinross and Milnathort - or even America, as in May! - get their tickets first, they will be there, as it is strictly first come, first served.

The swimming pool at Bountree is now up to its normal summer heat level, and is available for use as usual. That means **NO TEENAGE BOYS UNLESS AN ADULT IS PRESENT**, in addition to the "at your own risk" and other small print clauses. If we are not at home at the time there are no WC facilities available.

PUBLIC HALL ASSOCIATION

The Fete, which this year is in aid of Village Hall funds, is to be held on Saturday 19 June in the Wallace Park. The building which houses the present Hall was built between 1863 and 1871 as a school, with an adjoining school house. The house has the date 1863 above the front door, and according to James Mackie in his Annals of Arngask "the first day's enrolment (2 March 1871) was 107: 65 boys and 42 girls".

The present school was opened on Tuesday 5 September 1905, and a Village Committee was formed for the purpose of purchasing the old school as a Public Hall. In November 1906 the building was handed over for the sum of £101, the official opening, with tea and a concert, taking place on 28 January 1907.

From the records available three names stand out in the early history of the Hall:

1. The Rev. James Jack M.A. who was the driving force behind the committee which converted the old school. Later, 1929-30, he was Chairman of the committee which raised about £600 for the ante-rooms.
2. Mr. William Deas who loaned £220 at 4½ % for the purchase of the Hall, the platform, seating and two small ante-rooms.
3. Mr. J. Morrison of Scarrhead and Perth who continued the loan after the death of Mr. Deas in 1918. He generously waived all interest due, and some time before his own death made a gift of £220 to the committee.

In the 1920s and '30s the Hall became one of the focal points of Glenfarg, with events such as flower shows, and fancy dress dances run by the WRI. During World War II it was used for the storage of flour. From 1945 onwards the Hall has been used for community activities: Whist Drives, Dances, WRI, Keep Fit, Badminton, Scouting and Guiding, Scottish Country Dancing, Playgroup, Meetings etc.

Should the Village Hall ever become unusable it would be a great loss. It must be cherished as a vital link in our village life. The Hall committee has done, and still does, a very good job with an eye to the practical side of maintaining the fabric and furnishings. As a community we must not let this work go unsupported or taken for granted - indeed in the last eight months an excellent response to the Hall Fund Appeal has been given by the community, through the committees of 14 village organisations. To date £1400 has been raised.

Within the community, however, there appears to be an element of vandalism which targets the fabric of the Hall, resulting in blocked drains, damaged air vents, and broken slates, the latter caused by people climbing on the roof. It costs time and money to rectify the damage. Vigilance by all members of the community is essential to protect the Hall, our heritage.
