Community Council

The following is an extract from the minute of the meeting held on Monday 6 September, at which eight members of the public were present.

TREASURER'S REPORT The Treasurer reported that some progress was being made with the collection of outstanding debts. Cllr. Mrs. Ponton added that no new advertising would be accepted unless payment was received at the time of placement.

LOMOND BANK After some discussion it was agreed that the Community Council was unable to support the residents' proposal, concerning the making-up of the carriageway to Regional Council specifications. The residents should negotiate direct with TRC.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

The Avenue Mr. Mason reported that an application for planning permission to construct four houses on the north west side of the Avenue had been made by a Mr. J. Crawford. Mr. Mason stated his objections, and received the unanimous support of the Council. The Secretary is to lodge the Council's objections with the District Council Planning Department.

Main Streetthe size of the sewerage piping to be laid was holding up progress. Several Councillors expressed concern at the drainage and sewerage arrangements for this land, and the Secretary was requested to write to the Planning Dept. for assurance.

PKDC PROPOSED TREE WARDEN SCHEMEto monitor the location of trees in the village and surrounding area as an environmental asset, to make recommendations for tree preservation orders, to suggest areas where trees may suitably be planted or re-planted, and to locate and recommend the removal of dead trees. The Council expressed its support of the proposal, and Cllr. Learmonth agreed to act as the Council's Tree Warden, assisted by Mrs. Judy King and Mr. Bob Mason.

TAYSIDE STRUCTURE PLAN There is little in the documents of direct relevance to Glenfarg, but it was felt that the forward planning tended to under-estimate the potential growth of the Glenfarg/Milnathort/Kinross area as a very desirable residential location for people who work in the central belt, and commute to that area on a daily basis. The Secretary was asked to bring this to the notice of the Regional Council. It was noted that a public meeting is to be held in Kinross High School on 21 September at 18.30.

CHILDREN'S PANEL RECRUITMENT The Children's Panel Advisory Committee for Tayside is seeking to recruit new members (between 20 and 60 years). Application forms are available from the Chairman. Cllr. Mrs. Graham made an appeal for men to volunteer.

EUROPEAN TIME ZONES The feeling of the Council was in favour of retaining Greenwich Meantime, and the Secretary was asked to bring this to the notice of our MP, and the Council for the Protection of Rural Scotland.

COAL YARD SITE Mr. Lascelles, referring to the land adjacent to the coal yard site, asked if the Community Council could have it cleared and made usable, possibly as a car park. The Council agreed that this would be of benefit to the village, but wished to have the legal aspect of the proposal clarified.

ROADS Cllr. Mrs. Graham reported that she had received complaints about the use of the Hilton Farm road by large vehicles belonging to Fife Water Board, and had arranged with the Roads Dept. to have a warning sign placed at each end of the road indicating its unsuitability for heavy vehicles.

ENVIRONMENT The Council expressed its thanks to Mrs. J. McDonald for arranging for the provision of Dog Waste Bins in Wallace park.

ARNGASK PRIMARY SCHOOL Mrs. Macpherson reported that no Dux prize had been awarded this year, and asked the Council to clarify whether or not the Headmaster was at liberty to abolish this prize, which may be the subject of a Trust.

COUNCIL HOUSING Cllr. Mrs. Graham undertook to find out the reason for the delay in the provision of central heating.

The Bank House Garden

We had a successful Open Day for charity on 25 July under Scotland's Garden Scheme, and we have also had five groups of garden enthusiasts coming by appointment - one from as far afield as California. Most of these groups kindly made contributions, so we were able to hand over £533 to the Perth Samaritans, and £468 to Scotland's Garden Scheme charity. Many thanks to all who came and supported the Open Day, and particular thanks to Bob Gourlay for his splendid contributions to the plant stall. Next year we will open at a different time of year so that visitors don't always see the same set of flowers.

Readers may like to know what we have in mind for Glenfarg Green, the former coalyard and field. The pond is now completed, and will have water-loving plants round its edges, some of them huge, such as Gunneras. There is a sandy spit for children to paddle in, and a stone-faced area where they may dip jamjars for minnows etc. We mean it to be a wildlife pond, and various forms of life will gradually populate it. Any contributions of sticklebacks, newts etc. will be received most gratefully next year.

The coalyard has been reshaped, and the surplus soil from the pond used to cover the bricks and tarmac. In the spring it will be sown with a mixture of wildflower and grass seed. It isn't at all easy to get a wildflower meadow established, but that is what we aim for. Wild flowers like really poor soil, so we have a headstart there at least! It will also have trees and shrubs, with grass paths amongst.
