THE POND WHEN FROZEN It's fun to skate outside in the open air, rather than in a cavernous indoor rink. From mid-November till after the New Year the new pond has been frozen and weight-bearing for much of the time.

Unfortunately the skating has been severely restricted due to the annoying and thoughtless actions of the few, who repeatedly threw stones, boulders, branches and rubbish onto the ice. These fuse into the surface, and spoil it for skating. Signs asking people not to do this were torn down.

Further aggravation was caused when large rocks and concrete blocks were removed from the river bank and hurled into the pond. These were waiting to be used to mend the river wall. After that incident we informed the Kinross Police, who came to inspect, and said that if anyone sees people causing damage to telephone them at once.

We're happy for people to enjoy the ice when it is really hard, and safe to do so, but keep off it when it is even slightly soft on top, or after a snowfall. Even a snowball turns into a frozen, hazardous lump.

Community Council

The following is an extract from the minute of the meeting held on 3 January 1994, at which two members of the public were present.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT The Avenue the applicant had appealed to the Secretary of State against the District Council's decision to refuse planning permission for the construction of houses on the north-west side of the Avenue. The Chairman added that any resident who felt strongly about the matter should forward their views to the Director of Planning, or direct to the Secretary of State.

CHURCH BRAE A letter had been sent to the Director of Planning, PKDC, in support of objections by neighbouring residents to the amended plans for the house on Church Brae opposite Arngask Parish Church.

AMENITIES The Chairman, stating that he understood that United Artists were proposing to lay conduits for piped television to Glenfarg, posed the question that the Council might approach British Gas (Scotland) with the suggestion that they explore the possibility of utilising the same conduits for laying gas piping to the village. The suggestion was noted and discussed, but it did not receive the support of the Council.

FOOTPATHS The Secretary reported an appeal by Postmen for residents to clear the snow from the footpaths in front of their houses. Cllr. Smith stated that in his capacity as milkman he had found it much easier to negotiate the footpaths to houses if residents did not clear away the snow, as the clearance of snow left the footpaths in an icy condition and, therefore, much more hazardous to walk on than if the snow had been left. The Council agreed with Cllr. Smith.

HIRE OF MARQUEE The Council agreed to maintain the rate of hire for 1994 at that applicable for 1993.

From the Chairman

1992 was for many an "annus horribilis". Last year I remember thinking that the inevitable New Year would bring a change for the better for most people. How wrong I was!; even the weather let us down last year. This year, for some reason, I am equally optimistic; I wonder how the year ahead will treat us?

There are two aspects of village life which I can predict will happen with almost absolute certainty. One is the ability for building developers, both private individuals and companies, to flaunt the planning rules and virtually build "what they like, where they like" with not a wit of thought as to how the buildings are going to look when finished. So much for democracy. This year will see the Scottish Office plan the legislation for the unitary councils. I hope our political masters can either give the new councils some better and enforceable planning laws or just scrap the departments altogether. It seems pointless paying hundreds of planning officers their salaries when the recommendations they give are ignored with impunity.
