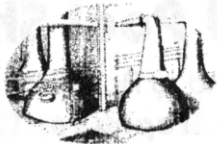

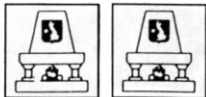

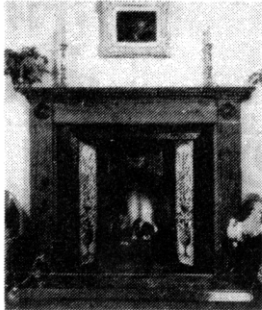

I was doing some research in the Perth Public Library some months ago and I was very interested to find your Glenfarg Newsletter there. I am writing to you now to ask whether you or any of your local readers can be of assistance to me. I have been researching the surname PATTILLO (and all its many variation) for some years, and have successfully traced hundreds of the family in various parts of the country and indeed, the world. The name, as you may know, is one of Scottish origin. I have frequently found it stated that it came originally from the place PITILLOCK, which is very near to Glenfarg. This is borne out by the fact that old Scottish records reveal many Pattiloches (etc.) as living long ago in your region. I wonder whether there are any legends that you or your readers know of that might corroborate the truth of this story? Some of your readers might recall a family of that name - or similar- living in the area. Or are there any traditions linking the place Pitillock with the surname Pattillo? I would greatly appreciate hearing from you or anyone who might care to get in touch with me.

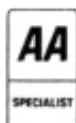

## ***GLENFARG GREEN***

### HOW ABOUT ADOPTING A TREE?

Glenfarg Green is for everyone, and we would like as many as possible to feel personally involved. It has been suggested that some individuals and organisations might like to "adopt" a particular tree or shrub, and be identified with it. Come from time to time to see how it is doing, talk to it, perhaps help keep its base weeded, and generally give it love and encouragement.

We think this is a wonderful idea, and if any groups or individuals agree, and would like to do this, please let us know. We would put up a small, but permanent, plaque beside each tree, giving its name, the adopter's name and the date. We would have to charge for each adoption, simply to cover the cost of the plaque. As yet we don't know exactly what it would cost, but would hope to do it for £5 - certainly not more than £10.

Because we tend to plant rather more unusual, and, we hope, interesting things, and because it is an exposed site, we have to wait and see which will survive our exacting winters. We won't offer trees or shrubs for adoption until they have been safely through at least one winter, and we are confident that they will thrive.

If the idea catches on we intend to publish in each newsletter details of what has been adopted, and by whom, and which are now available for adoption. The initial offer is limited to eight trees, listed below, and guaranteed good "doers".

The coalyard end of the Green has now, for the most part, been planted with trees and shrubs, though more will be going in later. In the late summer we shall be sowing the ground there with a mixture of grass and wild flowers. We hope it will look good next year, though we are told that wildflower meadows are notoriously difficult both to create and maintain.

Trees and shrubs available for adoption now:

ACER PENNSYLVANICUM	small tree, young stems green, striped with white and pale jade green
ULMUS GLABRA CAMPERDOWNII	small compact tree with pendulous branches forming a dome-shaped head
AESCULUS HIPPOCASTANUM	horse chestnut, white candle flower
QUERCUS FRAINE'TTO	Hungarian oak. Large tree with extra-long, lobed leaves
TILIA EUROPAEA WRATISLAVIENSIS	a form of lime tree, with leaves golden-yellow when young, becoming green with age
MALUS YUNNANENSIS VEITCHII	medium-sized tree with leaves turning crimson and orange in autumn. White flowers, fruits deep red
SORBUS ARIA CHRYSOPHYLLA	medium tree with compact, rounded head of branches. Leaves yellowish with white undersides
FRAXINUS EXCELSIOR PENDULA	weeping ash, medium tree eventually

## *Community Council*

The following is an extract of the minute of the Community Council meeting held on Monday 2 May 1994, at which 3 members of the public were present.

**TREASURER'S REPORT** ...the Chairman should make an informal approach to Cllr. Mrs. Graham regarding the possibility of an increase in the grant received from PKDC. Cllr Mrs. Ponton reported that it would be financially beneficial to change the format of the newsletter to that of the Kinross publication. Mrs. Ponton will obtain further details of the financial saving, and opinion will be tested in the village.

**DERELICT LAND** No response had been received to letters sent to the owners of the land. There is now considerable urgency in clearing the land, before the weed growth becomes well underway.

**BINN FARM PROJECT** Cllr. Curtis was appointed as the Council's representative on the liaison committee of Community Councils involved.

**TAYSIDE POLICE** Crime Prevention Panel has been reformed, and new projects are planned. There has been a spate of vandalism, but the main problem is drugs. A cycle-marking day is planned for Glenfarg.

**SPEED LIMIT, DUNCRIEVIE** The Chairman is to approach the roads dept. with a view to extending the 30 mph limit, now that street lamps are in place.

**ARNGASK PRIMARY SCHOOL** The Chairman was asked to explain:

- 1 the Council's role and its decision in relation to the award of school prizes
- 2 the interest on the balance of Glenfarg CC funds, and whether this could be used this year to assist in the award of school prizes
- 3 spreading the profits from the village fete across the three organisations currently involved, and Arngask School

With reference to point 3 the Chairman explained that something similar was suggested last year, but received no response. He suggested that the PTA and the school approach the three organisations direct.

The Chairman explained in detail the form of the Bond, the interest from which (if paid out) is to be applied for the award of a Dux medal at Arngask School. He reminded the meeting that at the March meeting of the Council there had been

lengthy discussion of the situation in the light of the Headmaster's decision not to award a Dux medal this year, and of the fact that the interest on the Bond being less than £50, it would not be paid out, and would be ploughed back into capital. In response to a clear question as to how much Glenfarg CC could afford to give out of its own funds this year to assist in the purchase of school prizes, a vote had been held and a decision taken by the Council not to devote the £50 available in funds to this purpose.. Cllr. Mrs. Ponton suggested that the vote had been misleading, since people had only voted against this application of funds on the understanding that this was all that was available; a reading of the Financial Statement submitted to the AGM had, however, revealed that a sum of approximately £2000 was held in the bank. Cllr. Drysdale stated that he would strongly oppose the disbursement of any accumulated funds for current purposes. Any donation to school prizes should only come out of the current account, and should not run down funds of capital.

There then followed a lively discussion, during which Cllr. Mrs. Ponton suggested that the principal be taken out of the Bond and given to the school to administer itself. The Chairman explained that, should that be the wish of the Council, such a move could be made by the Trustees of the fund, but not by the Council, which simply administers the Trust Deed. Cllr. Drysdale pointed out that there is considerable misunderstanding about the purpose of c Community Councils: as defined in the statute creating them, they are to provide simply a "channel of opinion". Neither by constitution nor in effect was the CC in a position to finance anything in the village. Although in previous years the Council had made the interest from the bond up to £140, the discussion of the possibility of this happening this year was irrelevant, since the Council does not have £140 in its Income and Expenditure account. Following further lengthy discussion the Chairman canvassed the views of the Councillors present, the majority adhering to the decision taken in the March meeting and agreeing that the matter could and should be reviewed next March. Cllr. Mrs. Ponton expressed her objection to this decision.

**COUNCIL TAX** Following the recent announcement by the Inland Revenue that a householder selling his house for an amount that would have caused it to be in a higher Council Tax band would be liable for the additional Tax, it was stressed that it is important to keep in touch with the Convention of Community Councils to hear of further developments, even though this plan has now been abandoned.

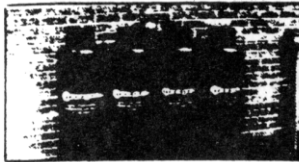

## ***Public Hall Association***

The AGM on 4 May was chaired by Mr. Lambie, who made special note of the unusually high attendance, and of the fact that the majority of those in attendance represented the youth of the village.

Reports by the Secretary, Treasure and Property Convenor were satisfactory, and were adopted by the meeting. The Treasurer reported that income for the year amounted to £11931.37, with expenditure of £4654.05. A handover balance of £7277.32 was thus recorded. The status of the Hall extension fund was £1584.

Mr. Brough was pleased to report that the criteria for the award of a Fire Certificate had been achieved, and that this had now been granted. Although the Hall is in a generally good state of repair, it was felt that the heating system is not. Members of the committee will pursue this further. The two centre strip lights in the main hall were noted to be faulty, and an electrician is to be contacted in this respect. Exterior paintwork will be assessed, and any work necessary will be carried out.

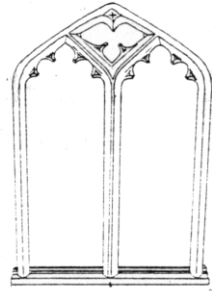

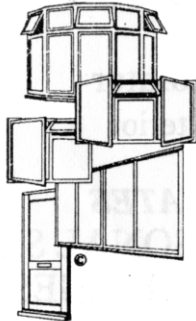

LOCH LEVEN We have noted that there is a new long-term high payments scheme for farmers: the Agri-Environment Program 20 year set-aside - Habitat Scheme / Waterside Margins. The Loch Leven catchment area farmers have a chance to get on the list of pilot schemes for this new programme, but they would need actively to promote the idea with SOAFD (SNH will help). It has already been agreed for the Tweed, Spey, Don and Dee catchment areas, but the Loch Leven area would be ideal. It seems that up to £360/ha is available for the Habitat Scheme, instead of £205/ha for the 5 year set-aside. This is surely a possible answer to the soil erosion problems, and the poor spawning of the indigenous brown trout. Any takers?

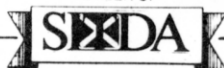
