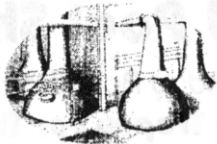

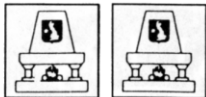

Be a Hero - Swim the Wallace Swim

In 1297 William Wallace helped his men capture St. Serfs Island in Loch Leven by swimming 3/8 of a mile to seize a boat. A sponsored swim, in aid of Fossoway Leisure Action Group, the Children's Hospice Appeal Scotland and various local charities, will recreate the William Wallace swim in the more comfortable surroundings of Loch Leven Leisure Centre on Saturday 24 September 1994 at 6.00pm.

The original distance of 3/8 mile equates to a modern 500m (20 lengths). Entries can be of two kinds: an individual swimming 500m, or a team swimming 4 x 500m. Each team must have a non-swimming Captain who is responsible for the organisation of the team, including time-keeping. Teams representing a registered organisation may retain 20% of the money raised by their sponsorship for their organisation's funds.

The Wallace in Kinross-shire

His tale was told by a minstrel called Blind Harry in the reign of James IV. While he claimed that his history was from the written record of Wallace's chaplain, Blind Harry has certainly "enhanced" the story.

Wallace found the Ochil Hills were an excellent base for his campaigning, especially in the Glenfarg area. It has a Wallace Road, and had a Wallace Cave, 18ft long and 6ft high, until it was destroyed by the railway engineers in the nineteenth century. About two months before the Battle of Stirling Bridge, on 11 September 1297, Wallace, after driving the Southrons out of Perth and defeating them at Abernethy, turned his attention to Fife, seizing Cupar, St. Andrews and Crail. While in Crail he made his plans to drive the last supporters of Edward I out of Burntisland. He was informed of a company of the enemy on one of Loch Leven's islands which "castle was nane, but walled with water wight", a clear reference to St. Serfs (the Inch of Loch Leven) After destroying the stronghold at Burntisland, he repaired to the east end of the Loch, and set up camp for the night. At around midnight Wallace woke 18 of his best men, and crept to the loch edge to observe the island. After some time he told them, "I can see no watchmen", and then ordered them "you will stay quietly here, and I will swim across and bring back a boat for you all"

The swim would probably have been in the order of 3/8 of a mile. He stole a boat and returned to his men, who used it to gain the island and dispatch to 30 men they found there. There happened to be 5 women on the island, and Wallace put them ashore at the first opportunity. The rest of his men (awaking from their sleep at the Scotlandwell hospice) were concerned about their leader's absence, until a rustic of Portmoak informed them of what had happened, and that Wallace wanted them to join him on the island. For eight days they feasted and drank of the captured stores. Then, bundling up what remained, they burnt the boat and set off for Perth, and destiny.

Community Council

The following is an extract from the minute of the Community Council meeting held on Monday 4 July, at which eight members of the public were present.

The Chairman opened the meeting by reading out a letter he had received from Cllr. Mrs. Graham announcing her resignation from local politics for personal reasons. The Chairman expressed his deep regret at her decision, a feeling echoed by the meeting as a whole. It was agreed that the Secretary should write to Mrs. Graham on behalf of Glenfarg CC conveying the Council's thanks for her support and assistance over the last few years. The Chairman later went on to welcome Clk. Russell to his first meeting of Glenfarg CC since being elected to serve as Regional Councillor.

DERELICT LAND ...contact had now been made with the husband of one of the owners, who had stated that he had no objection to the weeds being cleared it was agreed that no fundamental change of use should be carried out on the land, but that clearance work was unlikely to lead to objection from anyone.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT:

i) MAIN STREET the current drainage and road-building would be completed by the end of August, and that erection of the first few houses would commence in September.

ii) CHURCH BRAEapproval had now been given to a new application for planning permission for the house as built, (although subject to a few alterations involving the gable wall and the planting of evergreen trees parallel to the rear elevation). The Council condemned this decision, and asked that its strong disapproval be expressed, both through the Regional Councillor and direct through the Secretary.

ROADS work had been carried out to points affected by flooding, and maintenance would be performed as required.

ARNGASK PRIMARY SCHOOL The Secretary read out a letter from Arngask School Board requesting a meeting with the Council to discuss the award of school prizes. The Chairman confirmed that the Council has supported, does, and always will, support the school, welcomed the members of the School Board present, and stated his, and the Council's willingness at any time to discuss the matter with them. clarified between the funding to the school from the interest on the Bond set up by the ex-Servicemen's Association (which is determined strictly by the terms of the Trust Deed) and that from donations made out of Council funds (which is dependent on the financial status of the Council, and voted on annually). If the Council has insufficient funds it cannot make a donation: a vote to this effect was taken by the Council at its March meeting, and must stand.

A member of the public referred to the Headmaster's stated regret to the PTA AS the Dux table in the school ends in 1992, and that he had been unable, both last year and this, to pick out one individual for the award. Cllr. Russell commented that the new system of teaching is perhaps not amenable to the "first past the post" idea, and that there is, in some areas, a trend in education away from Dux prizes. Cllr. Russell and others, however, highlighted the fact that the award of a Dux prize need not be divisive, and that the general trend is not required to be followed blindly. Cllr. Drysdale also referred to the pageful of Perthshire school Dux listings in the previous Friday's edition of the Perthshire Advertiser. The Chairman pointed out that in the outside world there is competition in every walk of life, and that it is surely good for children to learn at school that someone has to be first.

Cllr. Russell suggested that the School Board would be well-advised to reinstate the Dux award, and that the Headmaster should be asked to review the matter if this would enable the school to get the Bond interest, at least. Cllr. Lady Maclean also stated that, although it might be difficult, it is always possible to reach a decision on choosing a winner, (a view confirmed by Cllr. Ross based on his long experience as Headmaster of the school) and that the decision should perhaps be taken in order to be sure of getting the Bond interest, provided there is sufficient accrued to be paid out. The Chairman confirmed that the question of whether the Council will be in a financial position to make a donation in the future will, of course, be looked at on an mutual basis.

Babysitting Circle

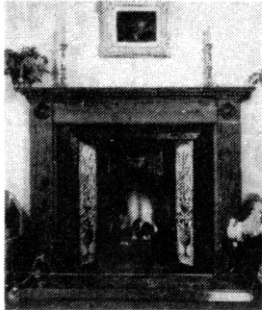

Weekend workshops are becoming very popular at Heatheryford, and two other regular exhibitors at the gallery will also be returning in the autumn. Ewa Kuniczak is coming back on 15 and 16 October to do a feltmaking workshop, and at a date still to be arranged, Anna King will be taking an exciting papermaking workshop - very messy but great fun!
