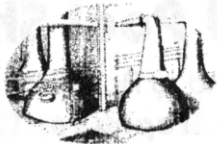

Editorial

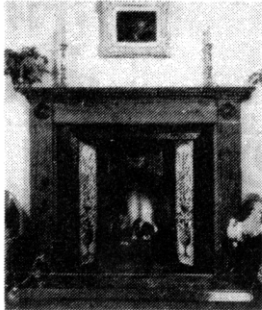
I am always pleased to receive readers' letters, and in this edition I am particularly pleased to be able to publish the first. It not only defends a village business against implied criticism, but it is an example of what I believe to be a function of the newsletter, which is to be a vehicle for readers' opinions, and if these are controversial everyone is at liberty to respond. Readers' views on this subject, too, would be welcome, but I believe that, as editor, I have to be impartial and give everyone the chance to air their views. I don't believe that I have any right of censorship, except where I know something to be factually incorrect, or where an item is blatantly offensive to one or more individuals. In both cases I would refer to the contributor, explaining that I was not prepared to publish the item. If I tried to perform any other censorship, where would I draw the line, and might I not be accused of favouritism to one side or the other? I should point out, incidentally, in case anyone is unsure, that I write only the editorial and any additional remarks which I sign. Some contributors don't sign their work, more, I suspect, through an oversight than any desire for anonymity, but all contributions other than those mentioned above are the work of a member of the organisation concerned.

The second letter is most interesting, and I certainly would support Mr. Moiser's suggestion. There is a wealth of knowledge and information, evident from past contributions to these pages, amongst both current villagers, young and old, and those who have left the village, so please, all of you, write to the newsletter, or direct to Mr. Moiser.

What a good idea to have Maj. Gen. Marindin, a gentleman who I am sure will appear in Mr. Moiser's history, remembered in the new development. I don't know where the name "Rowallan Park" comes from, but is a name really necessary? Shouldn't we be trying to make the area part of Glenfarg, instead of giving it a specific name, which surely encourages division?

ARNGASK - GLENFARG 1901 - 2000: A NEW HISTORY

To mark the end of the twentieth century, a New History of the Village could chronicle its development since 1901 and celebrate its inhabitants. Such a work, as I envisage it, would be a compilation rather than a piece of original research, and because my wife and I moved into the village only four years ago, we are perhaps not the obvious people to undertake it. Is anyone interested?

The History could include information on: buildings, (particularly those of architectural or social interest, constructed, restored or rebuilt since 1901, and those that have become derelict), individuals, events, details of village and agricultural life, landscape changes, village activities and the local economy, and would include photographs and maps.

Every villager should be invited to contribute, but I foresee that older inhabitants and those born in the village would contribute particularly. Individuals might care to write sections on the village's prominent families, the railway, the reservoir, the motorway, the postal service, the shops and tradespeople, the golf course, the bowling club, new housing, the Community Council, the electoral roll, the school, the Church and parish records, the village hall, the library, the war memorial, the garage, the hotels, and so on. I should be happy to collate and integrate the material - in a word "produce" the history - but there must be people better situated than I. Could I perhaps ask for reactions from readers? Perhaps some have already started this, or a similar project.

Whether the History would ever be issued in print depends on a lot of factors on which it must be impossible to decide yet.

Community Council

There follows an extract from the minutes of the meeting on Monday 7 November, at which 11 members of the public were present.

TREASURER'S REPORT In the absence of the Treasurer due to illness, it was decided not to renew the insurance cover on the marquee.

DERELICT LAND The Chairman had secured arrangements for the tipping of the spoil from the Binn Landfill free of charge. The spoil had been passed as fit for dumping. An offer had been received for the use of a JCB and lorry, and it was hoped that the plant would be available in approximately a month's time. It was agreed that Mr. J. McHardy should continue to liaise with the contractors on behalf of the Community Council.

DUNCRIEVIE SPEED LIMIT It is hoped to extend the 30 mph limit to link up Glenfarg and Duncrievie, but this is in the hands of TRC. Cllr. Ramage (Dist. Cllr.) informed the meeting that a report is being prepared, and money is to be spent, on traffic calming measures on the approaches to villages. Anyone with any suggestions relating to Glenfarg should let him know.

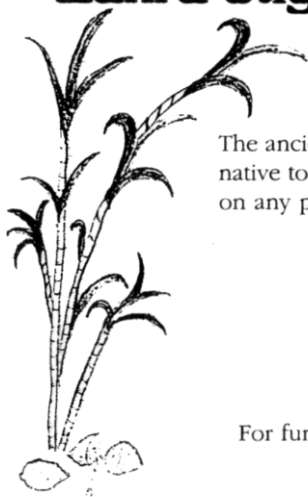

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

The Avenue The appeal by Mr. J. Crawford against the refusal of planning permission for the erection of four houses on land at the top of the Avenue adjacent to Arngask School had been turned down by the Scottish Office reporter.

Main Street The new development was to be known as Rowallan Park. It was thought that the local community, through the Community Council, should have some input in the decision on the name for the road through the development..... it was agreed that Maj. Gen. Marindin, formerly of Fordel House, a great benefactor to the village who had donated the land for the school, and had laid out the Golf Course, should be remembered in this way. Cllr. Ramage took note of this decision, and undertook to inform the Local Authority accordingly.

GLENFARG PLAYGROUP Mrs. Rachel Webb, Secretary of the Playgroup, gave a detailed and informative presentation describing the structure and operation of the Playgroup, and the financial difficulties which are currently being encountered. Following lengthy discussion it was agreed by all present that this should be supported by the Community Council, both with money, and with a letter to TRC lending weight to the argument in favour of the award of a grant. The Community Council would in the first instance guarantee payment to the Playgroup of £123.50, being the shortfall for the period to Christmas, and that, upon the recovery of the Hon. Treasurer, discussions would be held on what amount in excess of this could also be paid.

VANDALISM The Chairman reported on numerous and serious acts of vandalism which had occurred in recent weeks.... including removal of signs on paths, damage to trees and shrubs on Glenfarg Green as well as to the lights on the steps from Ladeside to the Green, damage to the railings beside the path to the Village Halt) damage in the park and private gardens, and the destruction of the bench seat at the side of the Arngask road. It was agreed that the police should be asked to increase their patrols, and that measures should be taken to make parents aware of the vandalism being caused by young people in the village - albeit a minority.

BINN LANDFILL SITE Cllr.Curtis gave a brief report of the visit by himself and the Secretary to the Open Day on 9 September.... the security arrangements seemed most impressive, and it was to be hoped that these would be adhered to. Members of the public were at liberty to visit the site by arrangement.

TREE WARDEN SCHEME Mrs. J. King reported on the work of the scheme, and asked that anyone with any suggestions for tree planting in or around the village should contact her.

The day centre in Perth, at Springlands, has room for 25 patients, who are brought there from all over the county by volunteers. There they meet each other, talk together, get involved with crafts, and can have physiotherapy. Some nurses are in hospitals and others visit patients at home. The Macmillan nurse does no "hands on" nursing, but has time to spend with a patient as long as she is needed.

On 15 November the video of the meetings of the various committees in Edinburgh was shown. This highlighted some of the topics featured in the four days. One was the experiences of Dr. Sheila Cassidy, who was imprisoned and tortured in Chile; another was the moving account of his search for his daughter by the Rev. Kenneth Macdonald in India. We were also shown how dance can be incorporated into worship. This evening gave an insight into the Assembly Meetings to the members who were not there.

By the time this is being read we will have had our annual Christmas Sale on 26 November - successful we hope!

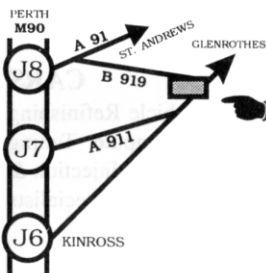

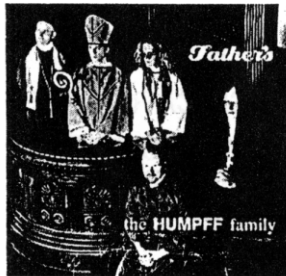

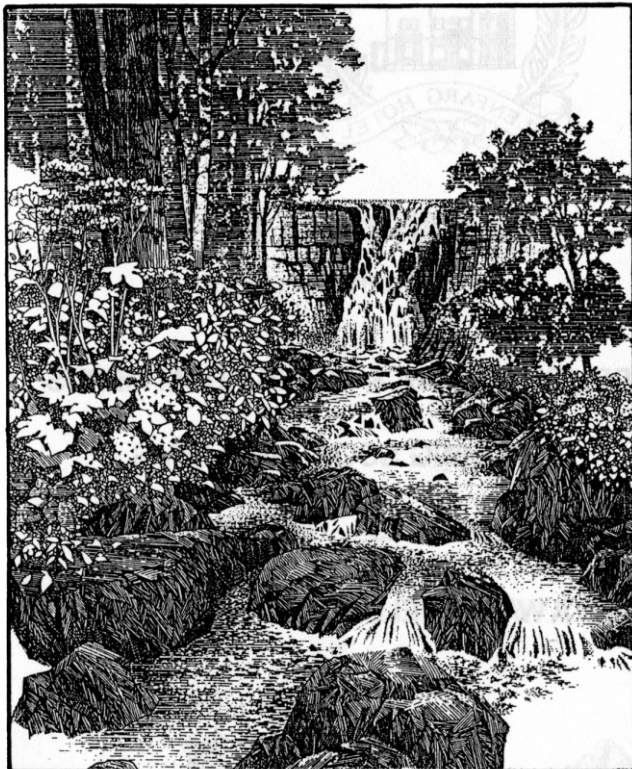

GLENFARG COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Vandalism has been a recurring thorn in the side of village life for many years, certainly as long as anyone has lived here. It seems to follow a cyclical pattern, with the perpetrators growing up, their younger peers taking over, and when the original vandals have become parents themselves; they are in turn vandalised by the peers of the younger peers and so it goes on. I have no wish to curb the excesses of youth, but sometimes things go a little too far.

This problem was discussed at length at the last Community Council Meeting, and it was decided to deal with this problem locally rather than involve the Police. Should you wish to criminalise our over-zealous youngsters...simply turn a blind eye to this problem. May I also remind parents that anyone trespassing on other people's property; although not committing any offence, does so at their own risk; therefore if anyone slips and injures themselves in a garden during the rather tiresome game of ringing my doorbell and running away, be prepared to receive a writ for damage to the lawn should you fall and break your ankle!

To the teenagers who are reading this: I feel sorry that you are bored, should you wish something else to occupy your time please contact me and I shall be more than happy to offer suggestions and advice. Remember, within a decade you are more than likely to be parents yourselves...do you really wish this lark to continue?

On a more cheerful note, my family and I would like to wish you all the most happiest of Christmases and a most welcome and prosperous New Year!
