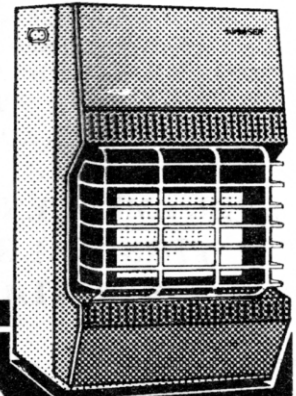

Tennis Club

It's been a while since there was any news from the Tennis Club in this worthy journal, so here goes.

Social Night Out The Tennis Club is organising a RACE NIGHT for the evening of Saturday 15 March, in the Cellar Bar of the Glenfarg Hotel. The event will be run by a professional organiser. He arrives with sealed videos of six horse races, and we, the "punters", can have a flutter. Individuals can become "sponsors", "owners" or "jockeys" as well, with special prizes for the winning owners and jockeys. Entrance will be £2, and this includes stovies and a race programme. Programmes will be on sale from most major outlets nearer the time, but first they have to be filled in with race sponsors, horse owners and jockey names, so look out for knocks on the door, and make a note in you calendar!

Tennis Club AGM The Annual General Meeting will be held in the Cellar Bar of the Glenfarg Hotel

on Monday 17 March at 8.00pm. Members and non-members are welcome. Nominations for election to the committee can be made in absentia if you want to stand but cannot attend the meeting.

General News Ever-increasing membership, combined with coaching sessions, means that there are now more people playing better tennis. In order to expand the opportunities for competitive tennis, for the forthcoming season the Tennis Club is entering a mixed doubles team and a men's doubles team into the Midlands League. At the same time the friendly tournaments and the two Perth & District League teams are recognised as vital components of the overall tennis offering in Glenfarg. With this in mind I've noted down below the main activities which we hope to have this season, (numbers permitting!). Full details, with membership and competition entrance forms, will be available shortly after the AGM.

1. Junior and Senior Coaching
2. Club Night on Wednesday evenings throughout the summer. An informal gathering where members can mingle, and mixed doubles tennis is played.
3. Ladies Night. On Monday evenings one court is reserved for the use of ladies. All ladies are welcome for this very informal gathering, where doubles tennis is played.
4. Monthly Sunday Tournaments. On the last Sunday afternoon of each month there is a friendly mixed doubles tournament within the club.
5. Friendly Tournaments. There are friendly tournaments organised throughout the season against local like-minded clubs.
6. A Perth & District Division II mixed doubles team This is the ideal atmosphere for people interested in trying competitive tennis, or just interested in having sandwiches and a pint at a neighbouring club.
7. A Perth & District Division I team. Mixed doubles again, with the tennis a little more serious than Division II, but the same friendly atmosphere.
8. Midlands League Henderson Vase Division IV. A mixed doubles league running after the P&D leagues. Generally understood to be a bit more serious than P&D tennis, with more travelling to away games involved. Our first experimental venture into the Midlands League.
9. Midlands League Men's Doubles Division VI. Again a bit of an unknown, but generally understood to be more serious than P&D, with more travelling.

That's it for now - look out for Race Night posters, and see you on 15 March!

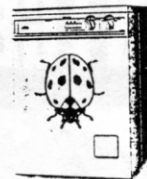
