Tree Warden Scheme

Stewart Crickmar, arborist for Perth & Kinross, Judy King and Maggie Williams, had a meeting with John Crawford, owner of The Avenue and the field known as Westmill Bank Plantation. With Mr. Crawford's kind permission, the following proposals have been made.

The Avenue has some cupressus trees, which pose a potential hazard and should be removed, together with the damaged lime tree and broken fence at the north west end. Occasional planting of shade-tolerant shrubs, such as hazel, hawthorn and blackthorn on the east side can be done in conjunction with Perth & Kinross Council, Perth &

Kinross Rangers and local residents of Glenfarg. On the west side of the Avenue Mr. Crawford would like a hedge of hawthorn and hazel established. It was also suggested that more bulbs be planted along the length of the Avenue, which could be done in the autumn. Further to these ideas is the establishment of a wildlife pond at The Spreads, and some Bean (wild cherry) at the south west corner of Westmill Bank.

It is hoped that the tree felling can be done before the middle of March, when the planting of the east side of the Avenue could take place.

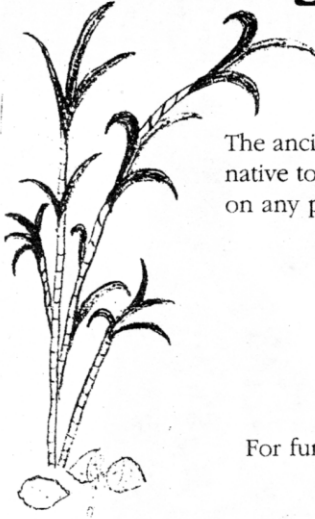

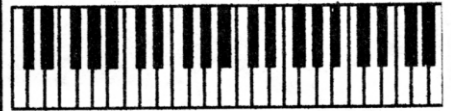

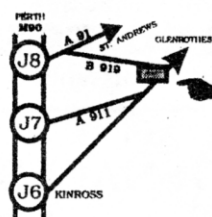

At the same time Mr. Reid was presented with a certificate of commendation from the Post Office, which was handed over to him, along with a bottle of whisky, by Maureen Clarke, Retail Network manager of Post Office Counters Ltd. in Perth.

I should like to thank all the many helpers who assisted in the distribution of the leaflets to every household in the village and surrounding district, and everyone who gave so generously toward the collection. The sum raised amounted to over £800: a magnificent total which was testimony to the esteem in which Mr. Reid was held.

The following is a summary of the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on Monday 3 March, at which no members of the public were present.

CRIME PREVENTION PANEL Cllr. Mrs. Buchan reported on the last meeting of the panel. Break-ins in the area were down by 50% during the past year, primarily due to random road checks. Up to 6 February there had been six break-ins in Glenfarg. Car thefts were down, but vandalism was up by 50%. An anti-vandalism campaign is currently underway. Speed traps have been in operation in the village twice in recent weeks.

ROADS The Secretary has been in touch with the Roads Dept., and arranged for repairs to be carried out in Greenbank Road following the recent heavy rainfall. Barriers will be erected on the river side of the Glen road, although timing will depend on the

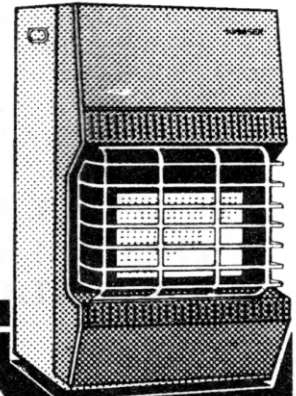

availability of finance. Measures to reduce the amount of water and mud on the Glen road will be looked into. Careful consideration will also be given to the erection of signs at each end of Greenbank Road in an effort to reduce the volume of through traffic, as well as to the introduction of a red strip at the north end of Main Street to slow traffic down.

TELEPHONES The Chairman announced that he had arranged a meeting with a representative of BT, who would be invited to attend the next meeting of the Community Council. Cllr. Curtis advised the meeting that 31 May was scheduled to be "digital day" for Glenfarg, when, contrary to earlier statements from BT, the village would be connected to the national grid of digital services.

ARNGASK PRIMARY SCHOOL The Chairman outlined the history of the donation of money by the Council towards the award of class prizes. Last year's cheque, posted through the school letterbox by the Secretary, had not been received. The Chairman stated the desire, echoed by the rest of the meeting, to bridge the gap with the school.

The Chairman proposed that an approach be made to the school closer to the millennium to discuss the award by the Council of an Annual Millennium Cup to the pupil who had shown the most endeavour in the face of physical or mental

handicap, adverse circumstances etc. The PTA and School Board will be informed of the suggestion, and asked for their reaction.

NEWSLETTER The Treasurer reported that he had had no response to the competition in the Newsletter, but it had been worthwhile as people had read the adverts. He reported that he had granted the Glenfarg Garage a reduction in the cost of their advert to compensate them for the cost of provision of toilet services to non-customers.

TREE PLANTING SCHEME The Secretary referred to a note circulated in the village relating to tree planting and maintenance work to be carried out in the Avenue. While this was entirely acceptable and to be welcomed, concern had been expressed by a number of people at the proposal to create a wildlife pond, which would be out of sight of houses, and would create a danger to children playing. The Secretary will write to the Tree Warden expressing this concern.

A&J STEPHEN The Secretary reported that it had now been confirmed that Messrs. A&J. Stephen were in negotiations about development of the site below the park at the south end of the village. It was agreed the Secretary should write stating the objections of the Council to this development on the grounds of drainage.

Woman's Guild

Apart from a most interesting talk on her bike ride from Nazareth to Jerusalem on 28 January, Miss Jennifer Irving was doubly welcomed by the Guild. Miss Irving's father and mother were closely connected with Arngask Church and Guild, so it was a happy return for Jennifer to meet ladies she had known in the past.

PC Ian Thomson from the Tayside Police Community Involvement Service gave helpful ideas on security in the home and on the streets. He told us of new developments whereby a person's details - name, next of kin, medicine requirements etc. - can be stored in a plastic tube in the fridge, thus enabling the emergency services to find them, and act more quickly.

The video "Jesus and His Times - the Final Days", was a graphic account of the trial and crucifixion of Jesus. Twelve people from Glenfarg attended the World Day of Prayer Service in Aberdalgie Church.

On 11 March Mrs. J. Black gave a demonstration of decorated baskets. This was most interesting, and the members were most appreciative.

By the time you read this we will have had the spring Coffee Morning on 22 March, and we look forward to the Rev. C. Williamson speaking to us on his work as a Prison Chaplain, on 25 March. On 12 May we hope to meet up with our Guildlink Church from Cardonald Church in Glasgow, when a party of them will make an outing to Perth. We will meet them at McDiarmid Park for high tea, and get to know our Guildlink friends.

8 April is the date for our AGM, when new office bearers will be elected.
