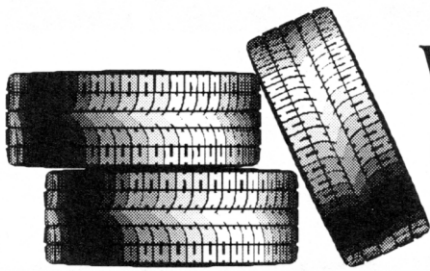

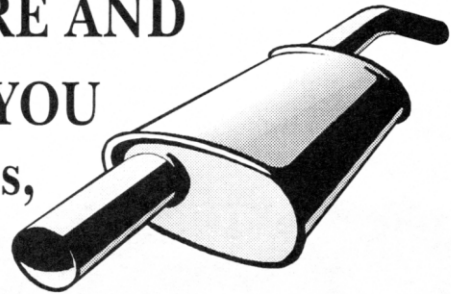

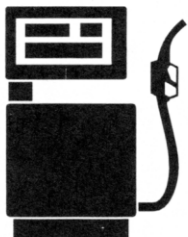

## *Glenfarg Water Treatment Works Improvement Scheme*

*from Degremont (UK) Ltd*

As many of you may already know, we have just commenced work on an extension to the existing Water Treatment Works at Glenfarg, for East of Scotland Water. These are significant construction works, essential to maintain the integrity of water supplies to large areas. The major works will last until early in the New Year, with completion in about June 1998.

During the course of the work, the access road will see an increase in traffic load through the village, although steps have been taken to ensure that inconvenience will be minimised. A one-way system for construction traffic has been instigated, approaching the site along Ladeside and departing along Greenbank Road.

Regrettably, however, there will inevitably be some disruption. All our drivers have been instructed to be considerate and alert at all times, and we ask all

other road users to do likewise. We apologise for any inconvenience these works may cause, but please bear with us for the duration of the construction period. We are certain that, with co-operation on all sides, we can minimise disruption, and complete these works on programme.

We would also be pleased if children could be advised that the site is not a playground. We have taken measures to ensure that the site is safe, but there is construction traffic, construction, excavations, earthmoving equipment and many contractors around the site. Please make children aware of the dangers.

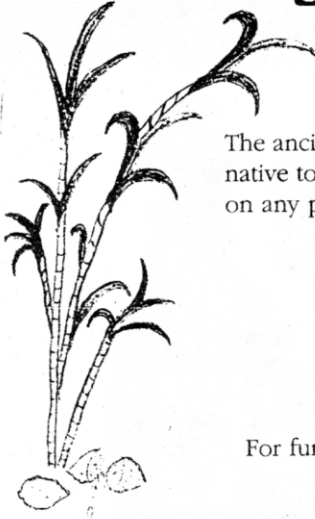

## *Community Council*

The following is a summary of the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on Monday 5 May, at which no members of the public were present.

**HYDRO-ELECTRIC** The Chairman introduced Miss Heather Barron, and invited her to address the meeting. Miss Barron explained that the huge area served by Hydro-Electric, with a customer base of 660,000, is divided into nine districts. It is obviously difficult to provide the same level of service to the Western Isles as to Aberdeen. Perth district stretches to around 8000 square kilometres, and is covered by 116 members of staff. Patrols are carried out round the villages, and when defects are found they are highlighted and repaired as part of an 'n-going process. Many short breakages in supply are for safety reasons. The rural areas tend to be more over-ground fed, leading to a greater frequency of problems. The underground network is more costly and difficult to maintain, and faults take five times longer to locate. £2 million is to be spent on refurbishment between 1995 and 2000. The newer equipment has greater tolerance for coping with adverse weather conditions.

After a brief general discussion, she invited people to contact her at the Inveralmond Depot in the event of their having any queries.

**CRIME PREVENTION** Nothing to report from the panel.

There had been a break-in some days earlier at the Lomond Hotel, and an attempted break-in at the school. Cllr. Dr. Moiser spoke of the severe vandalism to the seats at the side of the Arngask Road.

The police are trying to encourage Neighbourhood Watch schemes, and perhaps the whole village should become an area.

**RESERVOIR** Greenbank Road would not be repaired until after completion of work at the reservoir.

**REFUSE DISPOSAL** It is intended that wheelie bins should be introduced by the end of October. Black bags of excess rubbish will be collected occasionally, and additional wheelie bins can be purchased at a reasonable cost.

**DISABLED ACCESS TO BUILDINGS** The Disability Discrimination Act 1995 makes it unlawful to victimise disabled people. This act applies to voluntary organisations, and all such groups were encouraged to consider where their activities are held, and whether they are suitable. P & K Council has a policy to make available, free of charge, any of their schools, that may be required for such purposes.

## ***Community Council***

The following is a summary of the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on Monday 7 July, at which no members of the public were present.

**GLENFARG RESERVOIR** There was discussion about the current state of the construction work on the Reservoir. It was agreed that the Secretary should write to the East of Scotland Water Authority, pointing out that the longer this takes, the longer it will be before the road surfaces in Greenbank Road and Ladeside can be repaired. It is essential that repairs be carried out before the winter.

**FINANCE** The Treasurer would make enquiries about the placement of £4000 (earned from the hire of the marquee) in a separate high interest account. This would accrue for the replacement of the marquee, as and when necessary, or for some other cause for the benefit of the village.

**WALLACE PARK** The meeting deplored the amount of dog fouling in Wallace Park, largely as a result of dogs being allowed to run free. The dogs cannot be blamed, but rather, irresponsible owners who do not clear up after them. A specific exercise area would probably not be used, and therefore it was up to owners to be public-spirited and aware of the fact that the facilities were there to be enjoyed by others as well.

**PLANNING** An application for a landfill site at the small quarry behind Hilton Farm has been rejected.

**BEST KEPT VILLAGE COMPETITION** Glenfarg was once again being invited to participate in this competition, to be judged on Thursday 7 August. People were to be encouraged to tidy up their gardens for this event.

**COUNTRYSIDE RALLY** The attention of the meeting was drawn to the forthcoming rally in London, and to the importance of the continuance of hunting both for employment in the countryside, and for the preservation of horses and hounds. Those who protested against this form of fox hunting largely had no understanding of how the countryside works in practice.

**NOTICEBOARD** It was agreed that the CC should have its own noticeboard, and enquiries about suitable sites in the centre of the village are to be made.

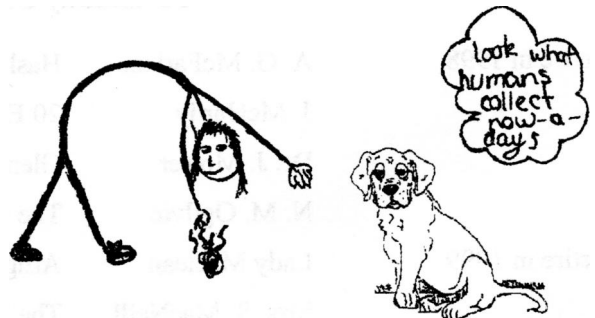

Staffing update - The position left vacant by the early retirement of Miss Howit will be filled before the end of the summer term. The vacant position of senior teacher will be filled by October 1997.

Finance - Planned expenditure for the next year includes a reading scheme for use in Primary 1, and updating of the computer systems throughout the school. 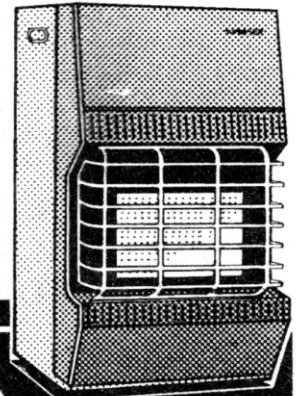

## ***Too Many Birds in Glenfarg***

As a resident of Glenfarg have you noticed the number of birds in the village? You may have had bird droppings on your washing, or been disturbed by the clamour of crows in the morning. The fact that there are quite a lot of crows in the village may seem normal, but in fact there are several hundred crows that regularly fly into the village to feed throughout the year. It is not unusual in the winter months, but during the summer with plenty of food available in the fields, birds in these large numbers are unusual!

Anyone who lives in the countryside appreciates the wildlife, and endeavours to encourage it in its natural balance. However we must be aware that communities do have an effect on natural wildlife, causing pollution of water sources, and by the killing of rabbits, hedgehogs and birds on the roads, to name but two.

Another way we can upset this natural balance is by feeding the birds. That may come as a shock, but let's examine the facts. Yes, feeding birds is good in moderation in winter months, and it should be done on a regular basis to help them survive when the ground is frozen or covered in snow; but in summer it tends to encourage larger broods than would normally exist. If it were up to nature to set limits for itself, birds would only have the number of chicks that the parents could physically support.

Birds bring a lot of pleasure, but I feel that you should not just feed them on an occasional basis ever, and if you do feed them in the winter months, do it only when the ground is frozen or covered in snow, and remember to feed them regularly and modestly, as food left at the end of the day may encourage vermin.
