Community Council

The following is an extract from the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on Monday 6 September, at which three members of the public were present.

SCHOOL SIGNAGE It was noted that the school road sign appears to be incomplete. The Community Council will contact the Roads Department.

SPEED SIGNS Cllr. Baird has liaised with the Roads Department regarding signs. The Secretary has agreed to write a letter requesting speed signs both north and south of the village.

PATCHING OF FOOTBRIDGE Cllr. McHardy has inspected the footbridge over the M90, and describes it to be in a very poor state of repair. The Secretary will write to the Council regarding this.

DUMPING IN THE GLEN Cllr. Campbell noted that dumping in the Glen had increased once more. He has liaised with the landowner, J. Bruce, who has agreed to allow the lay-by opposite the Bein Inn to be fenced off, but the Council would be required to meet the costs, and has to research any appropriate grants/funding available. Northumbria Water have agreed to uplift the rubbish already in the Glen free of charge.


ROADSIDE VEGETATION The pavement to Crawford Brae is now unusable due to overhanging branches. The Secretary will write to the landowners, Stephens, regarding this. It was also noted that two manhole covers along Crawford Brae appear to be creating a dangerous obstruction, and the Secretary will write to P & K Council

POLICE REPORT Inspector Findlay represented Kinross Police. He informed the meeting that Glenfarg had been quiet recently, and youth problems had eased off. Kinross-shire, however, has suffered a spate of break-ins, particularly during the afternoons. Generally individuals responsible have visited the premises beforehand on a pretext such as tree-cutting or metal-detecting. Police advice is for everyone to lock garages and outhouses. In addition businesses have recently been targeted by phone callers offering advertising space in a crime prevention magazine. Police say there is no local connection and, although the magazine is a bona fide journal, it has limited circulation.

TAKE A PRIDE IN PERTHSHIRE Euna Scott (P & K Council) gave a useful and informative talk on the history of the campaign. There are currently 30 committees with 365 members throughout Perth & Kinross looking at a variety of environmental projects, including the provision and maintenance of hanging baskets, development of gardens, and using shared responsibility of local groups to maintain areas of beauty. Committees set their own targets and receive guidance on funding. Consultation with the public is of great importance. The Council will consider inviting Euna Scott for a full presentation at an open meeting in the future.

LANDFILL TAX There were apologies from Mr. McGregor, Binn Farm, who had been invited to discuss income from landfill tax to be used for local projects. It is hoped to see Mr. McGregor at a future meeting.

It was reported that rats have appeared on the Main Street and surrounding areas, believed to be caused by the feeding of birds by a villager. The Secretary will write to the Environmental Health Department regarding this.

The grass cutting costs for Glenfarg Green amount to £100 annually. Mr. Lascelles has requested the Community Council to consider contributions towards this maintenance. As the Green is a valued area of beauty in the village, the Council has agreed to consider a variety of funding options, including the possibility of establishing a committee under the "Pride in Perthshire" campaign.

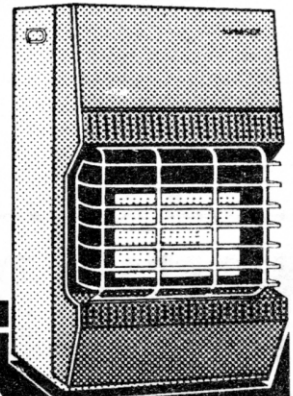

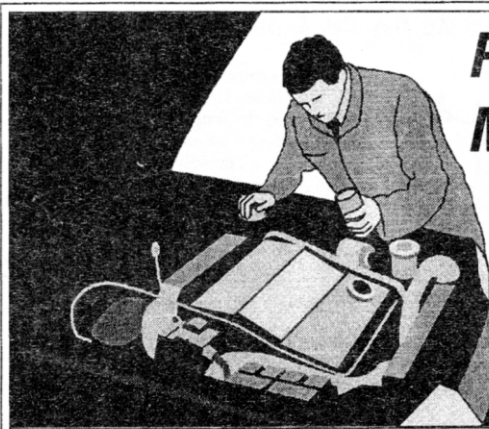

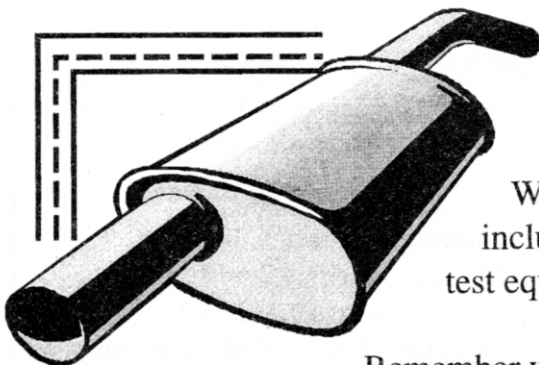

It is very likely that without that phone call, the three men would have escaped detection.</p> <p>Having said all that my proposal is as follows:-</p> <p>I plan to hold a public meeting in the near future, with at least one resident from each street in the village.</p>	<p>At that meeting I will be able to assess the level of interest and which parts of</p> <p>the village are likely to be covered. If we can attract a majority of residents to a village scheme, then most insurance companies offer discounts on insurance premiums.</p> <p>Once I have arranged the meeting, which I will advertise locally, I would appreciate the attendance of as many 'street representatives' as possible. In the meantime if you have any thoughts or questions regarding this proposal then contact me PC Steve West at Kinross Police Office. Anyone telephoning between 8.15am and 10am, other than to make an appointment or to ask for a house call, may be asked to call back after 10am. We have three telephone lines taking incoming calls, and prefer to keep them all free for appointments during this period of peak patient demand.

Surgery consultations are strictly by appointment only. Patients presenting as urgent cases (to relieve pain or suffering) will be seen the same day as an emergency appointment, but it may not be with the doctor with whom you are registered. Routine appointments will be given the first available time, and if this is not suitable, an earlier appointment with another one of the doctors of the same practice may be offered. Please let us know when you have to cancel an appointment, in order that we may offer it to another patient.

If you are unable to attend the surgery and need the doctor to visit you at home, please telephone Kinross 862112 before 10am whenever possible. Please remember that home visits are for serious illnesses and people who cannot travel to the Health Centre - the doctor can see 3 or 4 patients at the surgery in the time it takes to do one home visit.

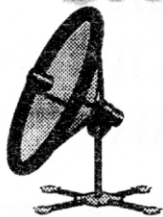

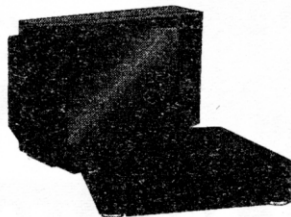
