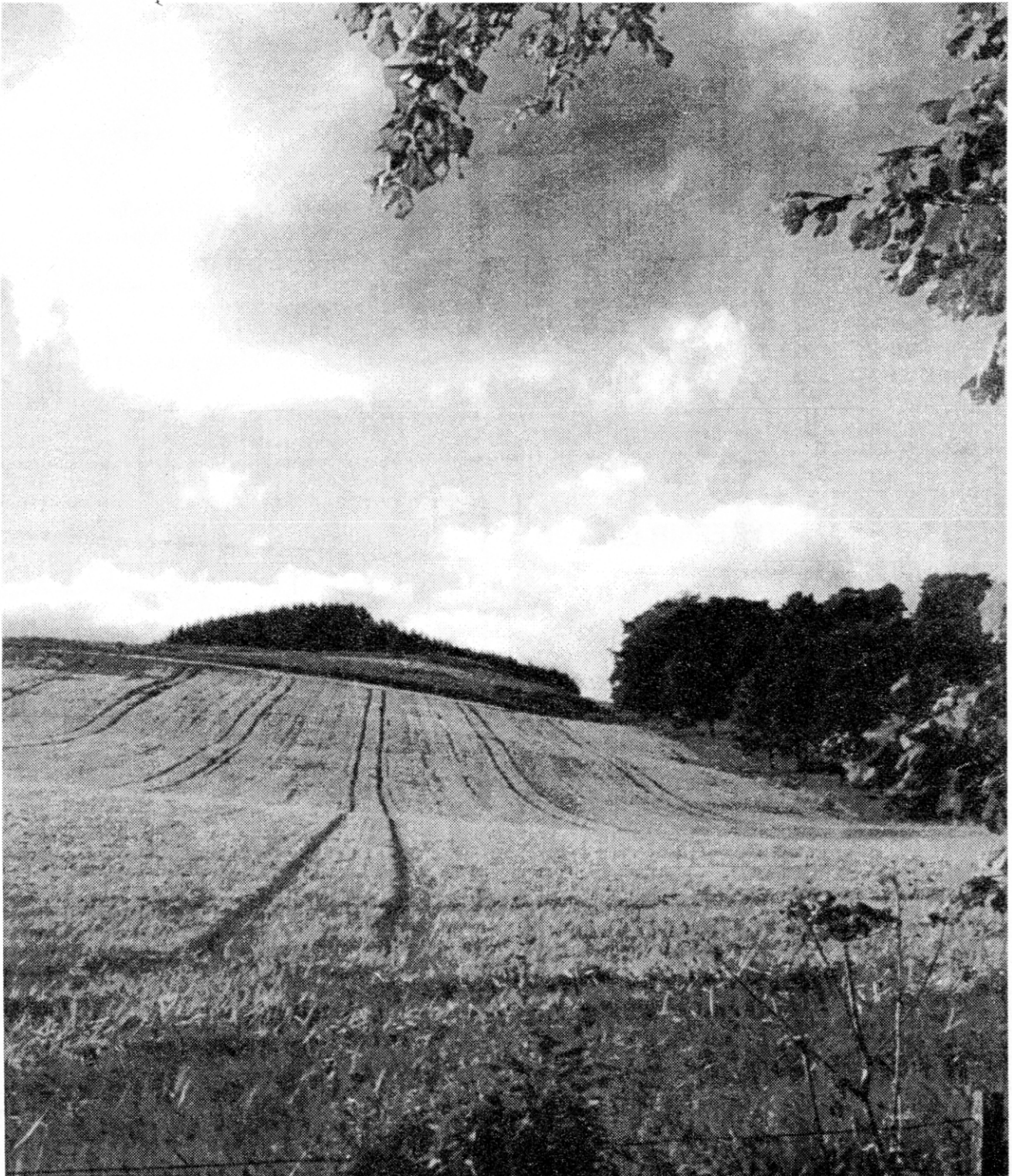

# **POLICE BOX**

## **NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**

As many of you will be aware Glenfarg now has a new and expanded neighbourhood watch scheme, which takes in the majority of the village and the surrounding area. The local co-ordinator for the scheme is Grant Smith from the village post office and it is he who is contacted by us if there is information to pass on regarding crime or suspicious activity. Grant will then pass it out to the local area co-ordinators in and around the village.

We welcome information regarding anything you think is suspicious, so please don't hesitate to contact us. I know what a great feeling it is to catch criminals coming from the scene of a crime and still in possession of stolen property and I can guarantee that you'll feel enormous satisfaction on contributing too that if you happen to pass on information.

In addition to the neighbourhood watch scheme, you may have seen publicity in the local press regarding the launch of a:-

## **FARMWATCH**

Many of the local farms are now part of this new scheme which covers much of the area Policed by Kinross Police. They have their own co-ordinators, namely Sandy Cook from Athronhall, Milnathort and Bert Gibson from Annacroich, Kinross. Again the principle is the same as neighbourhood watch. Just in case you may have seen the publicity in the Perthshire Advertiser, please note that I haven't changed my name, I think I'll stick with Steve West.

## **DUMPING IN THE GLEN**

I don't want to count chickens too soon, but there was publicity in the press recently which highlighted the dumping issue in Glenfarg. Since then I have noticed a lot less in the way of new rubbish etc and I hope this continues. Suffice to say I don't suppose the problem will go away completely, but if you do see anyone dumping tree cuttings then let us know.

## **FARM GATES**

It has been brought to my attention by a local farmer that a number of his farm gates have been opened, possibly deliberately, of late, allowing cattle to wander out into the roadway and on at least one occasion into someone's garden. After making enquiry it appears possible that children may have been responsible and as such I spoke to all the children at Arngask School. I cannot stress enough the dangers caused by cattle wandering on to public roads and into garden where small children may be playing!!!

I would ask all parents to make sure their children are not involved and to reinforce too them that such behaviour is unacceptable. Farmers are busy enough at this time of the year without rounding up cattle.

## *Scouts*

The Troop had a very cold camp the last weekend of the Easter holidays. Three of the oldest Cubs joined the Scouts for the camp at Morton Loch near Tayport. As well as the usual camping activities, the Scouts made full use of the fallen timber in the forest to construct an assault course, which impressed the Area Commissioner who visited the camp for the day.

May Bank Holiday weekend saw the Area Camping Competition, and the Troop entered a patrol of five in the novice section. They did exceedingly well with their competition meal of prawn cocktail, with the sauce made on site, chicken tetrazini and poached pears with Mars Bar sauce. The meal was cooked on a wood fire, and they came second out of all 15 patrols. All meals were judged, and the Glenfarg Scouts finished 3<sup>rd</sup> overall in the cooking part of the competition. Camping skills and activities are part of the main competition, and Glenfarg won the novice section, and were highly placed in the overall competition. Kenneth, Christopher, Ross, Alasdair and Michael were presented with their medals at the Area AGM by the Area President.

The Millennium Camp, when all the Scouts in the UK were trying to camp at the same time, though not in the same place, was during the last weekend of May. Glenfarg Scouts were camping with Kinross, Milnathort, Portmoak and Abernethy on the Harrier sub camp at Scone Airfield. Scouts came from Angus, Dundee and Shetland to Scone. Despite the continuous downpour on Saturday, and intermittent downpours on Sunday, we survived. Unfortunately the more adventurous activities were

cancelled because of the weather. The Scouts spent hours in the craft tent.

The Scouts went for a hillwalk in Glenshee at the end of June. It was a dry day and not too hot, with views of the Lomond hills and the Montrose Basin. A patch of snow had been spotted on one of the hills as we drove up, so we headed for this and had a great time playing on it.

On the last Thursday of the term the Scouts and Ventures walked up the East Lomond. Three Cubs – Gavin, Michael and Grant – were invested as Scouts on the summit. This was followed by a barbeque back at the car park.

A summer camp is planned for August, and activities will include canoeing, archery, hiking, fishing and, for the older Scouts, an overnight expedition. Kenneth and Christopher are part of the Perth and Kinross contingent at the International Scout Camp at Blair Atholl at the end of July.

The Troop was one of two in Perth & Kinross to complete the Outdoor 1999 Award. The six who were Scouts at the start of 1999 did at least 12 night's camping. The scheme has been extended into 2000, and Kenneth, Alasdair and Ross have gained their Platinum I Award by doing 32 different outdoor activities and camping for an additional 6 nights. The other older Scouts will have gained their Platinum I after summer camp, and some will have gained Platinum II.

Alasdair is one night's camping short of the seven required for his Gold Award. All the younger Scouts will complete their gold at summer camp.

## ***Cubs***

The three older Cubs have been doing activities with the Scouts prior to being invested as Scouts on the top of the East Lomond. Gavin and Michael were the first two Cubs in Perth & Kinross, and possibly in Scotland, to gain their Silver Outdoor Award. They spent four nights camping with the Scouts, and did nine different outdoor activities.

The Cubs have been orienteering in the park, and making bivouacs up at Arngask House. The weather has not been very kind, and has curtailed a lot of the outdoor activities. It is hoped that when we start again at the end of August we will be able to do some more of the outdoor activities, like the sausage sizzle. The Cubs camped with the Scouts at the Millennium Camp, sharing tents with them. They all got on well, and Ross has gained his Camper's Badges. It was very wet and cold, but we survived and enjoyed ourselves. The Sea Scouts

from Shetland paraded round the huge site in Viking costumes for the opening ceremony. It was very wet, but we followed the pipe band to the stage, behind the Glenfarg banner. At night the whole camp of 1700 took part in a Strip the Willow. All the Cubs, Scouts and Venture Scouts who were camping in Scotland did a Strip the Willow at 8 o'clock on the Saturday night. After the dance there was a rock concert. On Sunday there were aerial stunt planes flying over the camp site, doing loop the loops and other things. There were loads more things to do as it was dry. The tents were taken down in the dry, then we were caught in a hailstorm as we paraded round the campsite for the closing ceremony. Next year we will have our own camp at Crook of Devon, or another small site.

## ***Proposed Glenfarg Wine Club***

It is proposed to start a wine club in the village with the inaugural meeting being held in the Terrace Bar of the Glenfarg Hotel in mid-September.

The format is such that a wine expert will attend and deliver a talk, usually on a particular type of wine e.g. Merlot, Chardonnay etc., and offer tastings of the chosen wine type. There are normally six different wines offered to the members, so in effect each person attending will have the opportunity to sample six different wines.

There will be £4 entry fee for each member to cover the cost of the wine, and the chance (if any wine tickles your palate) to purchase a case.

It is proposed to have about eight meetings each year if we can generate enough interest. Obviously there will be the need for a committee to be formed, so anyone willing to become part of the first

committee, please let me know after the first meeting.

I must emphasize that this is not a commercial operation, it is purely a fun night out when the chance is there to broaden your mind and palate about the many and varied wines that are now readily available.

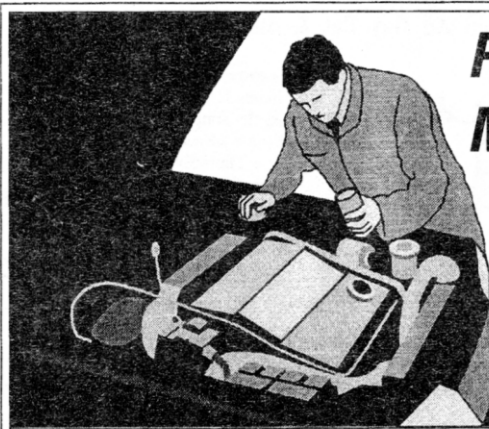

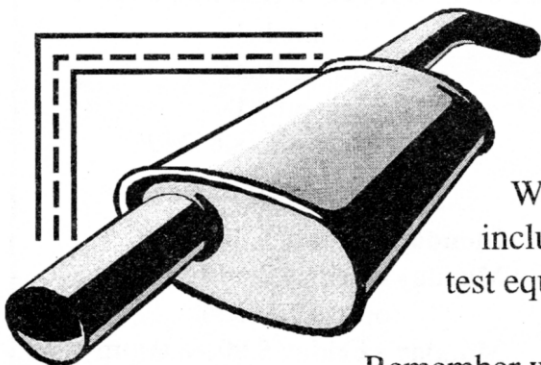

Patients are requested to wait until after 10am before telephoning for test results and on other matters. Anyone telephoning between 8.15am and 10am, other than to make an appointment or to ask for a house call, may be asked to call back after 10am. We have three telephone lines taking incoming calls, and prefer to keep them all free for appointments during this period of peak patient demand.

Surgery consultations are strictly by appointment only. Patients presenting as urgent cases (to relieve pain or suffering) will be seen the same day as an emergency appointment, but it may not be with the doctor with whom you are registered. Routine appointments will be given the first available time, and if this is not suitable, an earlier appointment with another one of the doctors of the same practice may be offered. Please let us know when you have to cancel an appointment, in order that we may offer it to another patient.

If you are unable to attend the surgery and need the doctor to visit you at home, please telephone Kinross 862112 before 10am whenever possible. Please remember that home visits are for serious illnesses and people who cannot travel to the Health Centre - the doctor can see 3 or 4 patients at the surgery in the time it takes to do one home visit.
