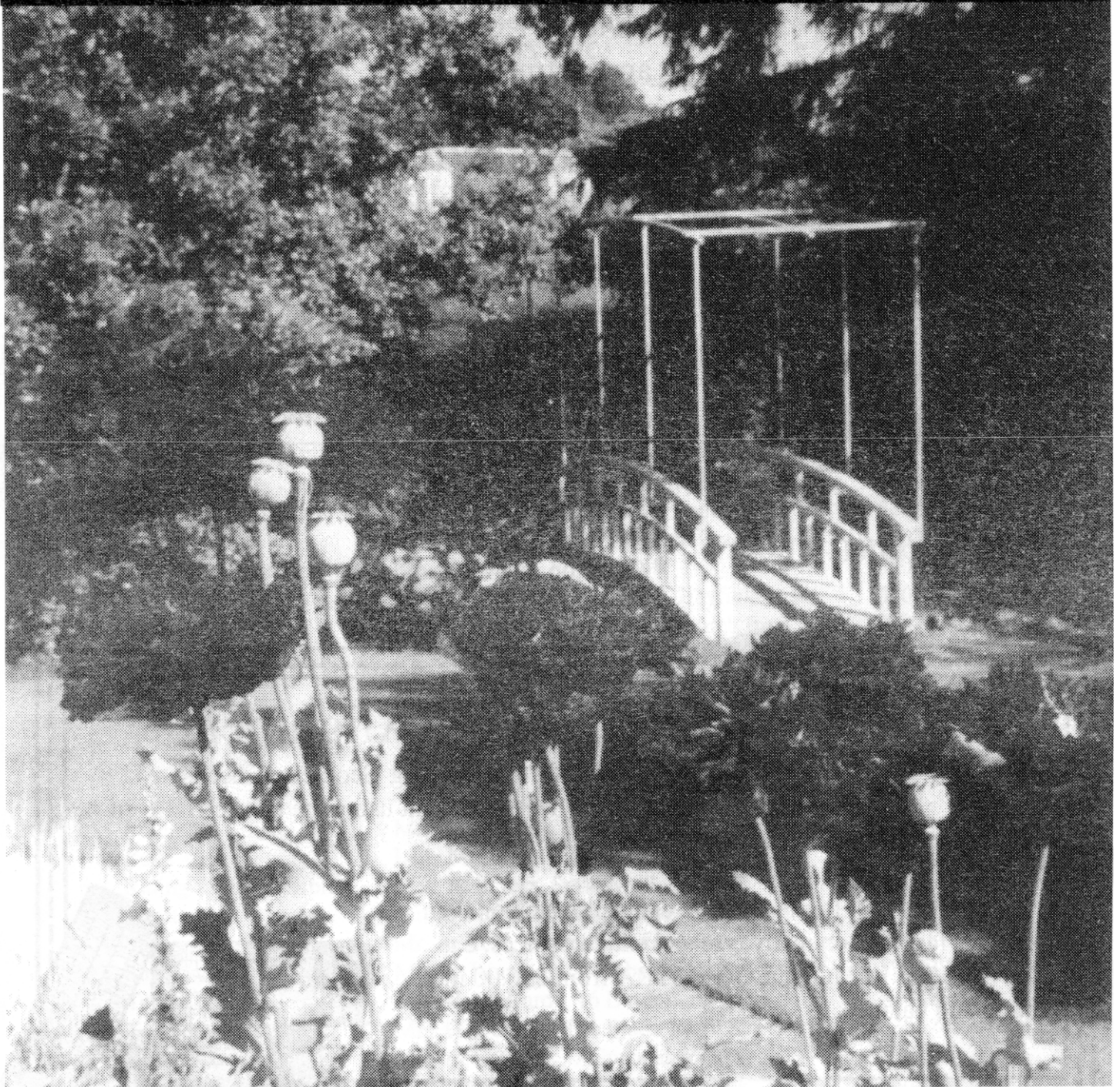

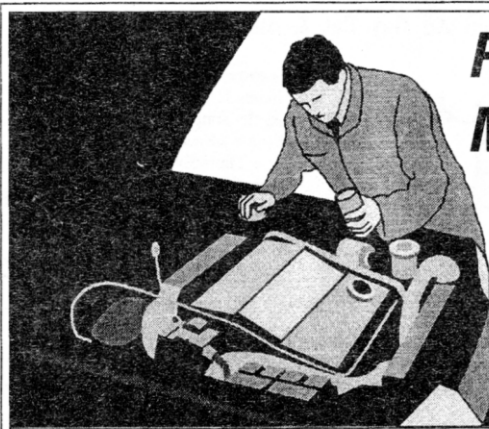

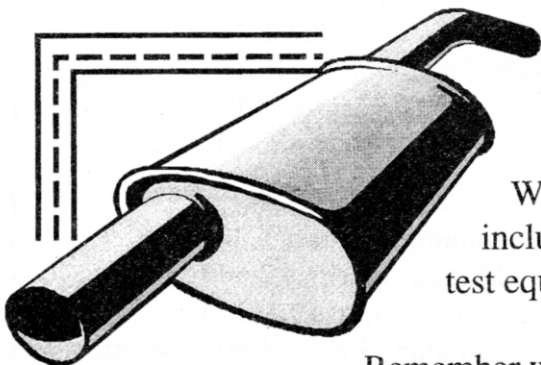

## *Community Council*

The following is an extract from the minutes of the meeting held on Monday 7 May 2001 at 8pm, at which two members of the public were present.

**POLICE REPORT** There had been a series of occurrences in the month of March. A vehicle in Elm Row and a garage in Greenbank Road were broken into. On both occasions tools were stolen. There were also reports of fuel having been siphoned at Gowanlea, an incident of 'fly tipping', and stones having been thrown in Duncricvie Road. On 30 March there were reports of disturbances caused by teenagers who were attending a 16<sup>th</sup> birthday party within the village.

**SURGERY AT KINROSS** There has been no further update on the issues in relation to the surgery and 'out of hours' cover. A public meeting remains on the agenda, however, as yet no firm date has been fixed.

**FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE** Perth & Kinross Council had taken steps to inform people about the need to keep off grassland, and, therefore, a local advert at the Post Office was not required.

**MARQUEE** The original marquee has now been uplifted from Lochgelly and is being stored at Arngask Farm. It is to be inspected for the possibility of repair

**STREET LIGHTING** Cllr Baird is to speak with Perth & Kinross Council in relation to the reported failure of street lighting between the village hall and the garage.

**DRAINAGE** Cllr A Curtis is attempting to trace the owner of land that appears to be the cause of poor drainage along the Tree Avenue.

**SURFACE WATER** Cllr Baird has reported the matter of water running down the Hilton of Duncricvie Road to the Roads Department. She has been advised that adverse weather conditions

suffered earlier in the year have not helped matters. Roads department plan to deal with matters as part of their normal maintenance procedures.

**COUNCIL FUNDS** It was requested that consideration be given to ways in which some of the Community Councils funds could be applied, which would benefit the village.

**BOND** It was decided that Cllr D Cameron should speak with the Arngask Primary head teacher about the fund set aside for awarding the 'Dux' prize.

**DOG FOULING** It was highlighted that some dog owners continue to behave irresponsibly. Dog fouling continues to remain an issue, and it was requested that the community remains vigilant for those people who continue to ignore repeated requests to clean up after their dogs.

Dog fouling remains a problem that is affecting street pavements within the village as well as Wallace Park. Cllr Baird is to enquire about the possibility of 2 additional red boxes for Wallace Park, and a letter highlighting concerns is to be inserted in the Glenfarg Newsletter.

#### **AOCB**

**TRACKS** Mrs. Janet Croft, Project Officer for TRACKS 'The Rural Access Community of Kinross-shire' is to be invited to attend the next meeting of the Glenfarg Community Council. TRACKS has been involved in a number of environmental projects within Kinross-shire, and is interested in identifying potential environmental projects within the Glenfarg area.

**GARDEN REFUSE COLLECTION** An enquiry was received concerning the possibility of Perth &

Kinross Council uplifting garden refuse from the village, as it had been identified that this process was operating in other areas. Cllr Baird is to enquire as to the possibility of Glenfarg being included, although she has been advised that this is a 'pilot' project. Additionally, collection of refuse takes place on a Saturday, and it is felt that refuse vehicles cannot get adequate access to empty bins in Glenfarg due to the number of vehicles parked in the streets. The geographical nature of Glenfarg may also be an issue. A letter is to be placed in the Glenfarg Newsletter.

**PAVILION** Cllr Baird has had the pavilion inspected following concerns over its condition. She is to speak with Perth & Kinross Council about their findings and the potential cost of repair.

**AREAS OF CONCERN** The following were highlighted:

The British Telecom cover on the east side of main street adjacent to Glenearn Cottage is insecure.

Pavements require to be swept after winter maintenance, and weeds killed.

The repairs to the footpath from the village to Crawford Brae commenced but have since stopped.

Hedge overhanging the footpath of main road on the south side of the village adjacent to Elm Row.

'Ponding' on the footpath and main road at the south end of the village.

Blocked 'gully' in Church Brae and broken gully at entrance to the bus garage.

Overhanging branches on the East Side of main street.

### *Police Box*

First of all I would like to apologise for my oversight in failing to submit my article in the last newsletter. There is, therefore, a bit of catching up to do.

**CRIME** Overnight on 17 March there were two crimes, the first of which took place in Elm Row, when a joiner's van was broken into and a quantity of tools stolen. That same night a lock-up off Greenbank Crescent was broken into, and again a quantity of tools was stolen. As yet these crimes remain undetected, although a number of lines of enquiry have been followed. In both instances the owners of the stolen property marked their tools in such a way as to make them recognisable if recovered.

Can I suggest that readers consider doing the same. In the event that property is located it helps us to reunite it with its owner.

**YOUTHS CAUSING ANNOYANCE** I have received a number of complaints relating to youths causing annoyance during the evening in Duncricvie Road, between Ladeside and Duncricvie. Though there have been no crimes committed, there have been reports of youths throwing stones into people's gardens, and of being a little boisterous.

If you are aware of any sort of behaviour which warrants a word in the appropriate ear, can you let me know.

**COMPLAINT RE FUNCTION AT VILLAGE HALL** I recently attended a meeting at the invitation of the Village Hall committee. This was in response to a complaint they had received from a local resident following a 16<sup>th</sup> birthday party on 30 March.

On that evening the hall was booked for a party from outside the village, and a considerable number of youths were resent, some of whom, it appears, were able to gain access to alcohol.

From my information there is nothing to suggest that alcohol was purchased in Glenfarg, and in fact the local licensees report that they refused to serve a number of youths. A number of complaints were made to the Police regarding noise, foul language and so on.

The Village Hall Committee has agreed that it will vet future events more rigorously, and that similar events for that age group will be subjected to conditions of entry, such as ticket only, with door control at the hall. This will prevent youths leaving the hall in order to consume alcohol, and should help prevent any unruly behaviour.

**SATURATION PROPERTY MARKING SCHEME** I have recently been exploring the possibility of a saturation property marking scheme

following a visit to Meigle, where such a scheme currently exists. Grant Smith from the Post Office, the local neighbourhood watch co-ordinator, attended a presentation in Kinross on 17 April, which was given by a representative from a company called Selecta Mark.

Selecta Mark has developed a marking system for property which is tailor made for each household, and allows the occupier to mark a number of items in such a way that if they are stolen and later traced, they can be easily identified.

The company provides large discounts for block enquiries, and if we can implement a scheme in Glenfarg similar to that in Meigle, then it can be publicised in the press and by suitable signs that Glenfarg is a property-marked village, and thieves beware.

Can I ask the area co-ordinators in Glenfarg to liaise with Grant Smith at the Post Office. If there appears to be sufficient interest then we can set up a meeting where I can explain the scheme fully.

### *Garden Refuse*

It is understood that Perth & Kinross Council is operating a garden refuse collection service within certain communities, and this is apparently being run on an experimental basis at present.

A request is to be made to the Council as to whether Glenfarg can be included within this pilot scheme, although it is believed that previously it has not been feasible on two points. One is geographic location, and the second is the problem

with collections. Collections take place on a Saturday, and the refuse vehicles would encounter difficulty in negotiating their way around cars parked in the streets while attempting to empty bins.

With this in mind it would be helpful if car owners with off street parking facilities were to make use of them whenever possible, and free up space at the side of the roads.

Our summer outing on Tuesday 22 May will have seen the end of our own programme for the 2000/1 session.

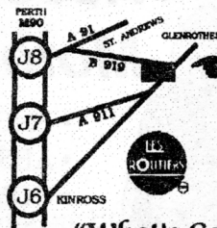

## *More Echoes of the Tennis Club*

At the AGM held in March 1927 the financial position was considered to be very satisfactory with £1-6-3d in hand. The year began, with what has obviously become a tradition, with an American tournament, in May. By the AGM of 1928 funds in hand had risen to £20, and there were 50 members. The Rev Jack was still Chairman, with Mr. Marshall as secretary/treasurer, and other committee members were Messrs. Henderson, Hume and Landsborough, and the Misses Graham, Ames and Murray. This year it was decided to erect a fence between the grounds and Mr. Beath's field, and some painting of the clubhouse was undertaken. It was agreed to "insist on the exclusion of children playing or sitting in the grounds, and to enforce the rule that Juniors must leave at 5pm if older people are wanting to play". In April Mr. Alex. Deas was asked to put up six lockers, at a cost of 10/6 each.

Later in the same year a dance and concert was held in the Village Hall in aid of club funds. Mrs. Lumsden offered the use of the hotel for a Whist Drive and dance, and this was accepted. Mr. J. Black became groundsman when Mr. Brown left the village. After some discussion it was agreed to buy a new hose. In the summer of 1930 Milnathort Club suggested a match with Glenfarg, and the

team members were: Mr. & Mrs Fowlis, Mr. Connell and Miss Nan Bryce, Mr. Marshall and Miss McGlashan, and Mr. Brunton and Miss Edith Robertson.

The following year Mr. Brown was offered a position at the Balhousie Tennis Club in Perth, and Mr. Mackenzie Sinclair, who it was rumoured was not continuing with his position at the Bowling Green, was approached to replace him.

In 1932 the question of courtkeeper arose again, and an advert was placed in the Post Office window. A meeting was held to draw up the duties for this person, and these included having the courts ready for play by 9 am and ensuring that the surface was "lightly squeezed with the wooden squeegee to remove any footmarks". In dry weather the courts "shall not be left dusty, but shall be well-sprayed twice a day". The courtkeeper's duties also included a considerable amount of gardening. Mr. Sinclair was re-appointed to the position at a salary of £20.

In order to encourage young players, the under 20s were admitted for an annual fee of 10/6, to be increased to £1 when they reached the age of 20.

That's all for this time, folks. More in the next edition.

Surgery consultations are strictly by appointment only. Patients presenting as urgent cases (to relieve pain or suffering) will be seen the same day as an emergency appointment, but it may not be with the doctor with whom you are registered. Routine appointments will be given the first available time, and if this is not suitable, an earlier appointment with another one of the doctors of the same practice may be offered. Please let us know when you have to cancel an appointment, in order that we may offer it to another patient.

If you are unable to attend the surgery and need the doctor to visit you at home, please telephone Kinross 862112 before 10am whenever possible. Please remember that home visits are for serious illnesses and people who cannot travel to the Health Centre - the doctor can see 3 or 4 patients at the surgery in the time it takes to do one home visit.

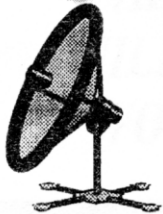

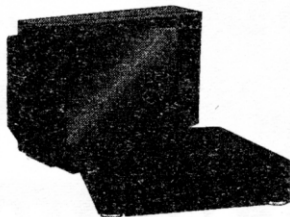
